# <sup>2</sup> LETTER FOR THE MONTH

Dear All

Many people say that charity begins at home, and in a very real sense that has to be true because in my opinion the family is one of the most important things in life. Exactly what we mean by 'family' is, of course, open to debate and has changed dramatically

over the last generation or so; not that long ago there was very little debate over what family meant to people - it was Mum. Dad and children, the extended family including Aunts, Uncles and two sets of Grandparents. I am not sure if it was ever an 'official' definition of family; whether it was part of an advertising campaign, or just part of folk lore, but I recall 'family' being defined as 2.2 children, a dog and a Volvo. For several social and economic reasons this is no longer the case and many children have step-parents and also often another 'set' of grandparents (not to forget the additional extended families). For some this can cause problems; for others it is something that they readily adapt to, and for others it is often something that enriches their relationships. Whatever your stance on the situation it is a fact of life and families are of the utmost importance whatever their make up.

As a Christian community we see ourselves as part of the Christian family, this too has its splits, divisions and 'fallings out' as does any other family, but despite this we have a responsibility to each other and need to learn to 'love' them

– even if we don't really like them. How then do I define Christian Love – well, with great difficulty in a short letter such as this, but an extract from St Paul may help; "Love is patient and kind. Love is not jealous or boastful or proud or rude. It does not demand its own way. It is not irritable and it keeps no record of being wronged. Love never gives up, never loses faith, is always hopeful, and endures through every circumstance". It is hard enough to do all these things to your 'nearest & dearest'; if you can do it to the people you don't like, well that really is showing Christian love.

Another way we can show our love to one another is by the things we do for them, which brings me back to where I started my letter, charity begins at home; again sometimes difficult even to those in the close family, and even more difficult to those more distantly related. This analogy holds true with the Christian family and there is an opportunity to support members of the wider family during Christian Aid Week which runs from 9 – 15 May. Christian Aid Week started out as the churches' response to the horrors of the refugee crisis in Europe after the Second World War and now raises about £9 million each year — and nearly £1 million in Gift Aid alone. If you can, please do give generously, because giving to a distant member of the family that we do not really know is another sign of true Christian love.







Four members attended the Annual Council Meeting in the Severn Hall at The Three Counties Showground in Malvern where the speakers for the day were Karen Tomlin from the 'Worcester Breast Care Unit Appeal' and Bob Flowerdew, organic gardener and author from 'Gardeners Question Time'. The Breast Care Unit Appeal is for a planned £2.5million stand-alone unit in Worcester for patients with cancer and other breast problems. It is planned to have quiet and private rooms for patients and relatives to discuss matters in peace and privacy with their doctors and surgeons and also landscaped gardens for the same reasons and where patients can have somewhere to sit on their own should they wish to do so. At the moment Breast Care patients have to sit in waiting rooms along with other patients with differing complaints and there is no privacy for discussion or contemplation other than the large canteen and of course the wards which offer no privacy other than curtains round the bed. Karen runs a lingerie business and specializes in bras for mastectomy patients. She has got the backing of the 'Guinness Book of Records', Worcester Cricket Club and several businesses, including Weight Watchers, Solicitors and others and her aim is to beat the World Record of having the longest line ever of linked bras. The record at the moment is held by Australia. Karen needs to collect over 200,000 unwanted bras which will be sorted and linked together by volunteers and will then be lined up at Worcester Cricket Ground and measured by the 'Guinness Book of Record' judges. It is hoped to sponsor the bras at £1.00 each, £10.00 each for businesses and to raise over £250,000,00. Afterwards all the decent bras will be sold and the rest sold to a recycling company who has agreed to buy them. During the meeting we all had to have a bra and wave it in the air for the media to take photographs etc. If you have any bras you do not want and you know someone in the W.I. just pass them along and we will see that Karen




