

# 2 LETTER FOR THE MONTH

Dear Friends



I have been asked to "fill" the Vicar's slot this month with an up to date 'round robin' of my training so far. It has not been without its moments both good and not so good! My husband and staff have been very tolerant when the stress levels rise, especially when trying to write

an assignment or rushing off to college for a weekend residential with all that needs doing before setting off with my overnight bag to Birmingham. The training is founded on two inter-related parallel parts: theological studies and formation for ministry. So here I am a month away from the end of my first academic year, and all being well a year away from ordination. But what have I done? The second weekend of September (last year) all those starting at The Queens Foundation for Ecumenical Theological Education gathered together for an induction weekend. Basically there are two paths for training: full time daytime, being in College from Monday to Thursday; or part-time evening - being in College for lectures every Tuesday evening. attending six residential weekends and one residential week at Easter. No prizes for guessing which pathway I am following! There are thirteen first year part-timers, the majority being on a three-year programme but due to having been a Reader, the Diocese recommended two years. In the first term my evening lectures were spent studying Bible in Preaching and Liberation Theology, in the second term Liturgy and in the third term (now) Pastoral Theology. In addition, in the Spring Term, I attended a daytime module (Thursday mornings) on "The Book called

Isaiah". The second weekend (Nov) we studied the composition of congregations, the third (Jan) communities, and the fourth (Mar) ourselves, including Myers Briggs. We have two more weekends - May, to look at how we relate to others, and June the decline of Christianity in secular Britain and the implication for mission and ministry. Each module involves at least a 3000 word essay - hence some of the stress levels!! This year our week's residential was during Holy Week and was the most amazing spiritual journey. The first part of the week we studied spirituality including a visit to a Jesuit house in Harborne. The second half of the week from Maundy Thursday, through various forms of worship, we journeyed with the disciples of Christ from the washing of feet at the Last Supper, into the darkness of the Garden to Gethsemane, to the suffering at the foot of the cross and the sheer desolation and loss of all hope on Easter Saturday, of which we spent five hours in silence...and I managed not to talk! I really enjoyed the contemplative experience and appreciated the benefits of occasionally getting away from the hustle and bustle of life to spend some quality time with God. The week culminated in a joyous Easter morning when we gathered together round the fire before going into Chapel to celebrate Christ's resurrection and the restoration of hope.

This third term also includes a three month placement (May to Aug) which I am spending with St Barnabas Church and Christchurch in Worcester. Finally my thanks and appreciation to all the support and love from people, both within and outside the church communities, I have received over the past nine months.





# ST RICHARD'S CARERS GROUP

The Hospice started the Carers Group with assistance of a grant from Help the Hospices as part of a national pilot scheme. We have been going now for nearly three years and provided support and information through the opportunity for carers to share their experiences, meet specialists to talk about illnesses, benefits, legal issues as well as practical things like nursing skills or aids and adaptations to the home or car.

Life as a carer can seem very isolated as it can mean looking after someone 24/7. It can mean financial problems. Friends may disappear as they find it hard to cope. Sometimes people have to give up work and a social life may become non-existent. Not surprisingly the carers' health can suffer.

The Carers Group at St Richard's is the only one in Worcestershire focussing on people who look after someone with a life limiting illness. For some people that can be a long and painful road as their partner, friend or family member becomes increasingly ill. For others, particularly with cancer patients, it can be a much shorter but just as painful. But they do have a lot in common and support each other in difficult times.

Sometimes what we and their fellow members of the group are able to give is a sense that the feelings they have – anger, guilt, loss, loneliness, fear of being alone, frustration at fighting the system or at not being able to communicate – are shared and perfectly normal. They may not be paid carers but they are a vital part of the care of patients and without them the cost of looking after someone would be huge.

Our role is to look after the carers so that they can go on doing this valuable work. They say that it is only when they come to their meetings that anyone gets them a meal. We have lunch together and often tea and cake as well and they do not have to wash-up. We share a lot of difficulties together but we can usually find something to make us laugh together. We organise a Christmas lunch and an outing this year went to Cadbury World so we know how to enjoy ourselves as well!
