HOUSING & HOME CHOICE PLUS

Are you, or is a friend or family member, looking for social/affordable housing in the Badsey & Aldington area? You may think that because of personal circumstances you (or they) will have no chance of successfully applying for a suitable property and therefore may not have registered. However, registering an interest doesn't just get you the opportunity of finding the right home but also helps the District and Parish Council plan for the future. It is believed that many single people or childless couples don't register because they think that only families stand a chance: but if singles/couples don't register their need then that need can't be taken into account in planning for the future.

If you are interested in housing in any of the areas covered by Bromsgrove District Council, Malvern Hills District Council, Stratford-on-Avon District Council, Worcester City Council, Wychavon District Council or Wyre Forest District Council then there is a single point of registration through Home Choice Plus. Once you are registered then you can search the housing available in all those areas on a weekly basis.

If you have internet access then simply go to http://www.homechoiceplus.org.uk and register on line or download a registration form. However, don't despair

if you don't have internet access or don't feel comfortable using a computer, you can phone Wychavon housing on 01386 565020 and either ask for a paper application form to be sent to you or register over the phone. Alternatively, go into the Evesham Community Contact Centre at Abbey Road, Evesham, Worcs, WR11 4SB where you should find someone who has been trained to help with questions about Home Choice Plus and who will also be able help you with registration. Once you are registered then you can check for available housing each week either on-line or by telephone. Again staff at Evesham Community Contact Centre will be able to help you if you have any difficulty accessing the service.

There are already three sites in Badsey which will provide some 'for rent' housing over the next few years: Badsey Fields Lane (in development), Brewers Lane (detailed planning application awaited, to include a substantial portion of affordable housing) and Banks Road (planning permission granted). If you want to have a chance of occupying that housing then register now!

TOWER NEWS


Welcome to 2011. Looking back on 2010, on the positive

FINANCIAL HELP FOR YOU HOME IN DIFFICULT TIMES

The scheme described in the article is a legitimate scheme run by the Malvern based Festival Housing Group. We have a pot of money from the government which we need to make home owners aware of as there is concern that many people live in houses which don't meet the Government's Decent Standards

(http://www.decenthomesstandard.c o.uk/about/standard). Care & Repair is part of Festival Housing Group and is based at Wychavon Council offices. They are administering the scheme to interested parties.



As expressed in the article there is an application process to make sure the Kick Start scheme is suitable, plus they have an appointment with an Independent Financial Advisor, who has no ties to us, to make sure the product is right for them (paid for by the scheme).

As a home owner it can be difficult to keep up with the household bills and keep your home in good repair. This is where a new scheme called Kick Start might be able to help. Kick Start is funded by the Government and administered locally by Pershore based Care & Repair Worcestershire.

The idea behind the scheme is to help home owners by offering affordable loans which can be used to:

- Modernise your home if parts of it need updating
- Make repairs to your home i.e. if the roof is leaking
- Adapt your home to suit a disability or difficulty

The emphasis is on affordability for you, the customer, and there are a range of payback options to suit most people. The application process will include an appointment with an Independent Financial Advisor so you can be sure you are getting the best deal.



CARING HANDS IN THE VALE

This is a wonderful organisation run by the Christian Centre in Bewdley Street. Activities include donations of food parcels, toiletry packs, bedding and clothing to individuals and families in a variety of circumstances, together with backpacks, sleeping bags and blankets to individuals who are homeless/sleeping rough. Caring Hands operates through a network of contact with community organisations and pastoral care in the church. All donations are made free of any charge to a wide variety of people in the community in the Vale of Evesham. This includes people on low incomes, in severe debt and have benefit issues, single parent families, ex-offenders, families of offenders, homeless/rough sleepers, people with addiction problems and mental health problems and also in crisis situations such as illness, injury, relationship breakdown and bereavement. "Caring Hands in the Vale" have now expanded their work to include the "Caring Hands Diner" where referred people can receive a hot meal twice a week.
