THE SHEPHERDS

We heard the story of the Shepherds at the Christingle Service and again on Christmas morning at St. James in Badsey. What intrigues me, is why the gospel writer Luke, who having "perfect understanding" would want us to know "the certainty" of the story? Why were these Shepherds chosen, and what was the significance of a birth of a Saviour to these Shepherds? Why were they prepared to take their flock across hazardous country to Bethlehem to check out what the angel had said?

The land round Jerusalem was royal land and sheep could not be grazed on the land except for the "lambs without blemish" destined for the temple sacrifice. The Shepherds who tended this flock had been brought up to know the Law which exposing their hearts, revealed their sin and their need for a sacrifice to restore them into a right relationship with a Holy God. They knew that the lamb sacrifice, was but a shadow; that the prophets foretold of a perfect sacrifice that would bring a permanent peace with God. To them the news of a Saviour being born in Bethlehem had great significance for them. They wanted to be sure so they set out to check out what the angel had said.

If I examine my every thought, deed and word, I know without a moment's hesitation I have failed to live up to God's perfect standard. When I see my reflection in the Holy Law of God – the 10 Commandments, I see a picture of a man in need of Grace. I cannot stand before a Just and Holy God unless I have a Saviour, someone to be that perfect "lamb without blemish", that perfect sacrifice to cover my sin. I am in need of someone to take the punishment I deserve upon themselves – who is willing to become sin for me. The news of a Saviour being born in Bethlehem has great significance for me. Many years ago I checked out for myself what the angel had said.

Why am I am talking about this story two months after Christmas?

Soon we'll be thinking of Jesus' sacrifice on the Cross at Calvary. Jesus was born to be that perfect sacrifice. He fulfilled the Law, perfectly keeping the 10 Commandments; living a perfect life without blemish. The Shepherds looked forward to the birth of the Saviour foretold by the prophets. I look forward remembering Jesus' incredible work of salvation on my behalf that enables me to be saved from the consequence of my sin.

I hope you will be willing to check out what the angel had said.





PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Lengthsman

The Council has now appointed Maurice Parkinson to act as Lengthsman within the Worcestershire County Council Scheme. Amongst other things the Lengthsman is able to clear gully grates, dig out blocked gullies, clear verge grips and headwalls, rod blocked drains on the highway (if practical), remove vegetation obstructing signs, side out footways to normal width, hand grit footways and carriageways from Highways approved grit bins, pull/cut noxious weeds (subject to WCC approval). The Parish Council acts as administrator but claims the costs back from the County up to a prescribed limit. Unfortunately the scheme does not cover public rights of way, as opposed to fcotways adjoining the highway. It is hoped that this will help the Council keep the Parish roads and adjoining fcotpaths in as good a state as possible. Further information can be obtained from the Clerk or the Worcestershire County Council website (http://www.worcestershire.gov.uk/cms/transport-and-

streets/streets/lengthsman-scheme). If you are aware of any matters which need to be dealt with please contact the Clerk. Please note that all requests for work to be done MUST go to the Parish Clerk, either directly or via a member of the Council. Please do not contact Maurice directly.

Snow damage

As day follows night, potholes inevitably follow the snow! If you are aware of any problems please either report them directly to Worcestershire County Council using the online facility or the Worcestershire Hub on 0845 607 2005 or contact the Clerk. Please try to be as clear as possible about where the offending hole is. Any water leaks or suspected waterleaks should be reported directly to Severn Trent Water either online (http://www.stwater.co.uk) or by telephone on 0800 783 4444.

Gentle Reminders Please would all house/landowners take the opportunity before the nesting season recommences to check that their hedges and trees are not overhanging/encroaching on various footpaths in the Parish (both public rights of way and at the side of roads). Remember to think about how your hedges/trees will affect the paths once they are back in full leaf. As pointed out in the September edition of the Community News if an owner fails to keep the footpath clear the County Council does have power to do the necessary work, and will then charge the landowner. Also would all landowners who have responsibility for drainage ditches take some time to check that they are cleared out to minimise any risk of flooding.

LETTER FROM BISHOP JOHN

Replies from Partnerships to October 2010 And Bishop John's visit

Bishop of Worcester

A few days ago I attended the burial of one of the oldest members of our Royal Family - about a thousand years after she had died. Queen Eadyth, or Edith, was the grand-daughter of King Alfred the Great. She went to Magdeburg in Germany in 929 at the age of nineteen to marry the Holy Roman Emperor Otto I, Otto the Great. She was buried in Magdeburg when she died seventeen years later in 946. Her remains were moved in 1510 and it was thought that her tomb was empty but they were unexpectedly discovered during archaeological works at Magdeburg Cathedral in 2008 in a lead casket with the name "Eagdyth" inscribed on it. They were reinterred this time in a titanium casket - in the service which I attended. I was there because the Diocese of Worcester has a link with the Lutheran Diocese of Magdeburg. What the whole experience brought home to me was how old and deep are the links between this country and Germany - especially Saxony where Edith lived and was buried. It was pointed out at the service that when she went there she and Otto would have been able to understand each other in their native tongue since she was Anglo- Saxon. Our histories - and with them our Christian history – are inextricably entwined.

BADSEY WITH ALDINGTON, OFFENHAM & BRETFORTON

KROPPENSTEDT (AND OTHERS IN HALBERSTADT EAST)

Nine of us visited Germany in 2009, with a memorable farewell service at Halberstadt Cathedral saying farewell to Christoph Hackbeil who was leaving to become Propst.

In 2010 we agreed a gap year as they visit their partners in the Netherlands and we went to Oberammergau.

There is to be a visit to UK by our partners in June 2011.

Cooperation between academics in the two countries was needed in our own day in order to identify her: scientists from the University of Bristol and the University of Mainz worked in partnership using cuttingedge technologies including micro- sampling to verify the origin of the bones. The twentieth Century was a terrible aberration as far as this long lasting friendship and cooperation are concerned. It was an aberration keenly felt in Magdeburg. The city was bombed almost out of existence by the Allies in January 1945 during the closing stages of the Second World War. Whilst there I attended a service of reconciliation which takes place at 12 noon every Friday at the same time as an identical one which happens at Coventry Cathedral. approach Remembrance Day and give thanks for those whose ultimate sacrifice ensured our freedom, particularly in the fight against the horrors of Nazism, I pray that the longer lasting friendship which has characterised the relationship between England and Germany will prevail in the Twenty-first Century and beyond.
