THE BADSEY SOCIETY'S TONY JERRAM AWARD PRESENTED TO LES GRINNELL

A record number of nearly 60 members of The Badsey Society, representing almost a third of the membership, turned up for the ninth Annual General Meeting on Friday evening. The same officers were returned – Mike Lovatt, Chairman; Terry Sparrow, Treasurer; Maureen Spinks, Secretary – and the six existing members, Will Dallimore, lan Gibson, Jane Neill, Richard Phillips, Valerie Magan and Neil Thould were re-elected.

At the end of the business section of the meeting, the annual Tony Jerram Award was presented to Les Grinnell. It is almost three years since the untimely death of Tony Jerram who was the first Chairman of the Badsey Society. The Committee decided it would like to remember Tony by donating an award which was to be given annually to someone who has contributed greatly to the community of Badsey or Aldington. Nominations were invited from the membership and six names were put forward. It was the Committee's decision to make the award to Les Grinnell. Les, who is Badsey born and bred, went to work for the Littleton & Badsey Growers after leaving school. He remained with them for his working life, apart from a spell in the Armed Forces during the war. He was initially involved with the tractor side of the business but moved on to herb growing. He has been involved with the running of the Royal British Legion for over 30 years, and for the last 17 years has been the local organiser of the British Legion Poppy appeal, commandeering volunteers and distributing



collection tins etc. The award was presented to Les by Mrs Barbara Jerram.

After the break, Valerie Magan gave an entertaining talk about Evesham Gaol and the police force in the surrounding villages.

Over the past few months there seems to have been one disaster after another, all of which very quickly disappear from the newspapers and television reports as another

story hits the headlines.

First it was the earthquake in New Zealand; this was followed almost immediately by the earthquake and Tsunami in Japan and the resultant problems with the nuclear reactors. Both of these disasters are now all but forgotten, that is, apart from those who have relatives or friends who were affected. The media (on the whole) do a relatively good job in bringing these things to our attention but, as I said, as soon as a 'better story' comes along the headlines change. While these disasters are in the headlines we are all encouraged to give generously to the various relief agencies to bring much needed aid to those affected, needles to say the donations of cash stop once the initial horror of the situation is forgotten. The government of the day (irrespective of party political views) also send aid at such times and I have heard it reported that people sometimes question "why should the government give money to 'x' while our own country is in such financial difficulties?" The answer from a Christian perspective is that we are all part of God's creation, all





.We now have 54 members in our W.I. and this number will hopefully increase during the year. With our art class full, our weekly walking group increasing in number, and more people entering County and National Competitions we are going from strength to strength. Our speaker in March was Avril Donovan who told us about the charity she has set up for the Children in the villages of Laos. These children live way out in the wilds of Laos and have very little comfort as we know it and are very poor. They have wonderful communities and each family try to make enough money to send the most intelligent child of their family to school. Family includes parents, siblings, grandparents, aunts and uncles, cousins and any other family members. The school is 3 days walk away, yes they do walk to school with a parent and then they board there. £120.00 pays for a child in Laos to have an education from first school to college, with the hopes they will qualify as a doctor, nurse, teacher or someone who will be able to give something back to their village. Avril was an inspiration to us all as she still goes out to Laos, and I am sure she will not mind me saying she is not a young person, and whilst there she sleeps on the floor of one of the houses, which are built on stilts, eats there very meagre food and uses there non-existent sanitary facilities as we know them. No toilets, running water, sinks, showers etc. A truly remarkable lady. The competition for a floral cuff was won by Yvonne Haynes. Whilst mentioning winning we are proud to say that we did extremely well in the County Spring Competition held at Malvern. We entered six classes and had good marks for each entry. Judging is very strict and entries are of the highest standard. The best news is that Sheila Taylor entered the floral art section and came FIRST with a wonderful arrangement interpreting "A rolling stone gathers no moss", the theme of the completion being

Proverbs. The four members who entered the cooperative class came THIRD with their interpretation of "All that glitters is not gold". Entries were a miniature flower arrangement done by Annette Robbins and Yvonne Haynes, a handmade card by Bernice Simms, this was a beautiful water colour which was marked very high, a lemon tart made by Patricia Millard and a beautiful piece of gold embroidery done by Hazel Stewart which received a 20 out of 20. All in all a very successful result. Judy Foster entered a photograph, Angela Gash a painting, Elizabeth Cudd bread Joy Payne a jar chutney and Patricia Millard a bottle of homemade fruit cordial, all received high marks. Well done everyone.

MIKE GWYNN, PARISH PATH WARDEN

Mike Gwynn attended the Parish Council meeting on 16 March to explain his role to the Council. Mike is the Parish Path Warden for Badsey and Aldington. He is employed by Worcestershire County Council on a voluntary basis to inspect the 10 km. of footpaths and bridleways in the parish, put up waymarking signs and carry out minor vegetation clearance. He also reports to the County Council instances where paths are obstructed or where major vegetation clearance is required, so that action can be taken, which may involve use of contractors or volunteer groups. Mike will be glad to hear from anyone in the parish who has concerns about a public footpath or bridleway. He can be contacted on 01386 830365 or via the Clerk.
