# OUR GERMAN PARTNERSHIP



Our partnership is part of the Diocese of Worcester and Propstei of Magdeburg-Halberstadt which started in 1987 and was officially established in 1997

The aim of the Partnership is to promote and develop links between our two churches (Anglican and Evangelical Church in Central Germany{EKM} www.ekmd.de). At present there are fifteen partnership groups in the Diocese. Our own link was formed in 1998 and was one of the first. We are linked to some fifteen churches in Kirchenkreise (Deanery) of Halberstadt-Ost around the villages of Wegeleben, Kroppenstadt, Hausneindorf, Emersleben and Schwanebeck which was in the former German Democratic Republic.

We have learnt much about each others worship, culture and lifestyle. Our partners suffered much during the GDR with restrictions on freedom and worship and have made us realise how lucky we are to have not to have had these sorts of restriction placed on our lives. Over the years friendships have formed and private visits have taken place.

We visit each other regularly and the program includes visits to attractions both secular and religious. There is usually worship every day, using both languages. Over the years we have had some wonderful experiences and thought provoking times during visits.

# 2 LETTER FOR THE MONTH

Dear All

Some of you may know Anne Potter who runs the Post Office at Offenham; Anne has been training for the past two years at the Queens Foundation in Birmingham and will be Ordained as a Deacon in the Church of England at the

Cathedral in Worcester on the 5 July. Following her Ordination Anne will serve as Assistant Curate in the Benefice of Badsey with Aldington, Offenham and Bretforton. Following her Ordination Anne will move on to the next stage of her training here in the villages of Badsey, Aldington, Offenham and Bretforton and in twelve months time she will be Ordained as a Priest. During her continued training Anne will be taking a variety of services in all three Parishes and assisting many others.

Ordination is what the church calls a Sacrament (the others being Baptism, Confirmation, Holy Communion [or Eucharist], Confirmation, Absolution, Marriage and Unction [anointing the sick]); a sacrament is the outward sign of an inward and spiritual grace (the outward sign in Baptism for example is the use of water through which the person receives the grace of God). In Ordination the outward sign is the laying on of hands and anointing by the Bishop.

At her Ordination Anne will make declarations to the Bishop to proclaim the gospel in word and deed, as an agent of God's purposes of love; to serve the community in which she serves

bringing to the Church the needs and hopes of all the people and search out the poor and weak, the sick and lonely and those who are oppressed and powerless.

All of this may sound very ethereal, unearthly or spiritual, which is exactly what it is, but it marks the beginning of public representative ministry in the Church of England. The most striking difference most people will probably detect is that they will increasingly see Anne wearing a 'dog collar' in around the villages.

As Anne's training incumbent I have certain responsibilities to Anne and to the Bishop during her training, but as a Parish you also have certain responsibilities to Anne. These range from offering a wide range of ministerial opportunities, to helping her in her transition from the lay to ordained status.

During her training in the villages Anne must not be seen as just 'an extra pair of hands' but will need the time and support of us all to help her grow into the role of what it means to be an Ordained Priest in the Church of England.

Being called to serve God as an ordained minister is a privilege as well as a challenge, it is something which I have enjoyed since my own Ordination as a Deacon in 1997 and I pray that Anne will be equally blessed in her future ministry.

Badsey WI had another interesting monthly meeting. Our April speakers were 2 ladies, volunteers with the National Trust, who came to talk to us about Croome Park, its history, and the great works paid for by the 6th Earl of Coventry who employed a young 'Capability' Brown to landscape the gardens, including moving the Church from next to the house to the top of the hill where it added to the view. The park has been owned by the Trust for a number of years and they are trying to reinstate it as it was when Brown planned and originally planted it, by using the wonderful old records and modern aps. The house has only been acquired fairly recently and is empty of its original furniture although the Trust have traced some items and eventually these will be returned. The house has been occupied by various people since the family left, including being a School and the base for the Hari Krishna monks. Some of the outbuildings are now privately owned and are not in such good condition but it is a changing situation. The ladies brought a few slides, not too many as to be boring, and had the knowledge to answer members questions. Several of the members had visited the house and gardens last summer on a WI outing and many had made private visits. The competition for the month was for a picture or photograph of a tree and this was very well supported. The quiz team were absent as they were taking part in the Group Quiz organised by Childswickham, we shall hear how they faired next month. Members agreed to support the Church mini-fete on the 13 May, two members will visit Wickhamford's Fashion show on the 10 May, another two are going on Hampton's trip to St. Fagan's Museum on 25 May. On 09 May 40 WI members with friends enjoyed a visit to the Royal Hospital, Chelsea, home of the famous men in red coats, the Chelsea Pensioners. They enjoyed a tour around the Hospital guided by one of the pensioners. It now houses nearly 400 retired military personnel, not all soldiers, including 4 ladies, in very tiny rooms. These rooms are slowly being extended so that each resident will have a bedroom with a private sitting room and bathroom. Members enjoyed chats, over cups of tea, with several of the men and had a very interesting day. A visit to Felix Dennis's garden at Dorsington is planned for 23 June. At our May meeting we will discuss the Resolutions to be discussed at the National AGM in June so that we can instruct our delegate on how to vote. The resolutions are on closures of local libraries and mega farms (3,000 dairy cattle). Our June meeting on 13 June will be held in a member's garden, weather permitting, and members will meet at the Village Hall car park at 6.45 pm to fill cars for the short journey taking with them a plate of food to share, plate and cutlery and a folding chair if possible. If wet of course then we will be in the Village Hall as usual at 7.15 pm.

# A WEEKEND IN BADSEY CHURCH

On Friday 13 May Badsey School Choir kicked our weekend off with a performance to open the Mini Fete. They entertained us well and were enjoyed by all. Tea and beautiful cakes were served in the cafe style side chapel. Gliders were made and sold by the Brownies, it was fun to see Richard (vicar) flying one of these over the tea ladies. Children also iced jigsaw shaped biscuits with our Sunday school team. Church folk sold plants, jams, pickles and other items. First to set up a stall was Evesham Volunteer Centre who as usual brought an amazing selection of goods to sell. The WI had a variety of stuff to sell in the churchvard. Outside the Scout Fellowship cooked and sold hot dogs and onions, Badsey Butcher's best sausages, very tasty. The best thing for me was as they were leaving a couple saving, "We spent a lot of money, but it was a really happy evening and haven't you got a lovely church?"

Early Saturday morning saw the tea ladies from the night before plus a few others, cleaning and polishing the church ready for the afternoon's wedding between Jamie and Julie. The church was adorned with flowers and bows to welcome family and friends of the couple. Julie and Jamie had beautiful bridesmaids and a page boy as they made their wedding vows to each other. The church choir and organist led the singing. In the evening, Robin Ward an international harpist played to an audience in church. He told us about the history of the triple harp and about the pieces he played. We learned it has two banks of strings on each edge and a third bank in the middle which he described as being like the black notes on a piano. He then entertained us with a variety of music written between 13 and 20 century, including works by Parry, Sophia Corrie, Bach and Hagen. He also played a selection of Celtic tunes which he learned as a 9 year old. Not only does Robin play the triple Harp, he builds them and teaches it. An array of services happened on Sunday. A Family Eucharist at which the junior choir sang "Any dream will do." The service was followed by a social time at which news was exchanged as we drank tea. In the afternoon another family came into church for the baptism of Cade Arran Churchill. The family chose this day because it was Cade's first birthday, double celebration! The weekend ended with a service from The Book of Common Prayer of Evensong, a quiet reflective time to complete the day and a very busy but happy weekend. There are lots of people to thank who made this weekend possible, those who helped in any way, and those who came to the fete, the church cleaners, the families who came into church for the wedding and baptism. ## SUNDAY 19 JUNE LET'S CELEBRATE FATHER'S DAY

By the Rt Rev John Inge, Bishop of Worcester

A quick glance in shops at the moment reveals shelves stuffed full of men's gifts and cards, which must mean only one thing: it's Father's Day again. Unlike Mothering Sunday, Father's Day does not have its origins in a church festival: is it just an excuse for card shops to make money or should the church take it seriously?

Fathers are never far from the headlines, from controversies around teenage fathers to reports on how good fathers have such a positive influence on the development of their children. All this coverage shows that we instinctively recognise the importance of fathers to us individually and to society as a whole. So we shouldn't be surprised that this emphasis on, and honouring of, good fatherhood is a reflection of the way in which God deals with the human race. I have always believed in my head that God loves me unconditionally but it was only when I became a father myself that I began to understand it with my heart. From the moment when I first set eyes on my first child, now aged ten, my love for her was so immediate and strong that I would have done anything to protect her - and still would. And that set me wondering about the love of God: if I, with all my faults, could love like that, then maybe I could understand in a new way how it is possible for God to love me like this. I have never known a love quite like the love of being a father and I rejoice in the great gift of fatherhood. I rejoice in it because of my children, to whom I am devoted. But I also rejoice in it because it helps me to understand more profoundly how God loves me, and how nothing can separate me from that love. When Jesus told the story of the prodigal son, in which a father joyfully welcomes home a son who had squandered all that his father gave him, it was to reveal the way in which God (whom Jesus tells us to call our Father) wants to relate to us. It's a tragedy when we hear of, or experience for ourselves,


