FROM THE REVD RICHARD COURT

However we approach the 'New Year' it will contain for us all periods of joy and times of sadness and sorrow - that much is guaranteed. It is also true that as the year progresses we will each do things that will fail - because that is the way of life we cannot always get things right (although at times it does feel that everything we do seems to go wrong). People say that it is out of failure that we learn, however we do need a few good successes to give us the ego and the self-confidence to see that we can achieve something. Some have called the principle that 'success comes from failure' a 'spirituality of imperfection'. Richard Rohr a Franciscan Friar likens it to ice skating 'we move forward by actually moving from side to side'.

We are imperfect and we move forwards only by lurching from side to side, so as we step out into the uncharted waters of 2012 let us all acknowledge that we will make mistakes along the way, but that there is an ever-loving God who is watching over us; a God who knows the pain of hurt and agony; a God of love and understanding. We may not be perfect, but we are made in the image of God, may God bless all that you do this coming year.

We then begin the New Year with our annual lunch which this year takes place at Dumbleton Hall.





On your Marks for the 2012 Games....

However, the 2012 games will be enjoyed by people throughout the UK and is a great opportunity for churches to connect with the community, perhaps through showing key events on a big screen or by hosting a 'pub quiz' which will be sent out earlier in the year by the diocesan Evangelism and Church Growth group.

There are also other opportunities set out on the 'More Than Gold' website. More than Gold is an ecumenical organisation set up to try and help churches make the most of the opportunities that the 2012 Olympic Games can offer and has a tried and tested programme of outreach, hospitality and service to meet the needs of every church - whatever your size, location or make up. 'More than Gold' suggests that in order to prepare your church for the 2012 opportunities you:

Start early with talking, praying, planning

Involve every section of the church - youth and children, evangelism coordinators, teachers, mission committees, social responsibility activists, and more.

Start with what is there already - what is the church already doing that can be given an Olympic overlay? Alpha? Holiday clubs? Schools outreach?

Identify how the local community is engaging - and look for ways to join in rather than compete

Join with other churches to plan major initiatives for the community like Community Festivals with a big screen, children's holiday clubs, etc

Appointing a Gold Champion - who will receive their own dedicated eNews update, On Track, and invitations to special briefings and link with Gold Champions in their area to share ideas, plans and opportunities



Amongst matters discussed at the November meeting was the approval of the Council's response to the South Worcestershire Development Plan Preferred Options document. As previously promised the Council's response can be found on the My Parish website (see above) under 'Consultation Papers'. The Council also set the Precept for 2012-3 and considered a request for parking restrictions around the junction of Old Post Office Lane and the High Street. It was agreed that the request should be supported and forwarded to the County Council.

LOCALISM BILL/NEIGHBOURHOOD PLANNING REGULATIONS

The Localism Bill has now become the Localism Act 2011 and it is understood that the changes it makes in relation to Parish Council powers will come into force over the course of 2012. The Localism Act includes significant changes to the planning and planning enforcement process including provisions as to Neighbourhood Plans. There is currently a government consultation on Neighbourhood Planning Regulations which closes on 5 January. The Parish Council will have discussed this at their meeting on 21 December and any response will be filed on the 'My Parish' website.

FUTURE MEETINGS

The next meeting of the Parish Council will take place on Wednesday, 18 January 2011. It is anticipated that there will be a Planning Committee meeting on the same day.
