Dear Mr. Webb,

I obtained the enclosed estimate some time ago for the two pairs of front gates which we propose erecting, when we build the stone wall, but nothing further has been done in the meantime. You will observe that provision is made for the posts to be 11 feet apart, whereas, I think you suggested 10 feet only. In these days of large motor cars perhaps you might be disposed to arrange for the larger space.

My object in troubling you ^{now} with
the estimate and drawing is that
we may have your opinion as
to the design and the price.
Bearing in mind that we
require two pairs of gates
and that the estimate ^(£6.9/-) is for
one pair only, it ~~seems to me~~
~~that~~ it might be well to
obtain another estimate, say,
from Mr. White. for I cannot
help thinking that the price
quoted is somewhat high. The
gates are not to be painted
for I propose treating them

but not the estimate
with siderolenum. The drawing
you will observe includes posts
but these will not be required.
as the hooks will be built into the
stonework

I have written Wheeler asking
whether he could come to us on
Monday week for a little while.

We propose erecting the wall in the
front of the house using the
material in the wall in front
of the kitchen garden, as you

I suggested some time ago.

Copy Estimate

13 March 1908

We estimate the cost of providing a pair of gates filled with 1 - 6" Bolt and gate latch and 5' long with No 2 pairs of 30" Redrums strings, with hooks to be built into brickwork to a 6" x 6" deal gate stop 2' long. The whole to be painted two coats to be all in accordance with the sketch at the sum of £6.9/-

This price is on Rail at Paddington the Railway carrying to Weston will be about 5/-
