Letter For The Month

Dear All.

As I sit writing this letter the news from around the world seems rather depressing, we have just had reports of a bombing at the Boston Marathon with several people being killed and many others injured – this in the light of the upcoming London Marathon (which will have taken place by the time you read this); the fire at a fertiliser plant in Texas which turned into an explosion killing a number of people; it has also been a week when we have seen the funeral of Baroness Thatcher as well as several funerals in our local villages, as I say all this makes rather depressing reading. By the time May comes along most people will have forgotten Easter as a distant memory, whereas in the Church calendar the Easter Season does not conclude until the middle of May and we will, at the beginning of May, be celebrating Rogation Sunday – a time when we give thanks for the crops that grow in the fields - something particularly relevant to us here in the Vale of Evesham famous as we are as a growing region of the country. It is easy at times to feel depressed with all that is happening around us, but just as the Easter Season continues longer than we may think, so God's love for us all continues longer than we can either know

It is difficult at times to see God at work around us, and thinking of growers and all those who work the land, this is particularly true with the weather over the past twelve months, therefore our Rogation prayers this year will be all the more heart-felt as we shall, hopefully, by then be seeing the signs of new growth ready to be harvested later in the year. A thought for this month is don't give up on God, because he won't give up on you.

Christian Aid Week 12-18 May

Bite Back At Hunger



Christian Aid Week was first held in 1957 and is Britain and Ireland's longest-running fundraising week. It is famous for its distinctive red envelope that drops through the letterboxes of millions of homes every May, and for the thousands of volunteers who dedicate their time to raising vital funds to help poor communities around the world build a better future for themselves.

This year, Christian Aid Week is highlighting the fact that tonight 1 in 8 people will go to bed hungry, but there is enough food for all to eat and have their fill if certain changes are made. Christian Aid works in partnership with communities and organisations in 48 countries, supporting innovative projects to help people transform their own lives from barely surviving to truly thriving. In droughtprone southern Zimbabwe, Christian Aid partner Dabane Trust worked with local communities to access the clean, naturally filtered water that is stored, hidden, beneath sand-bed rivers, ensuring people have a supply of clean water. Now they can water their gardens all year round, meaning they can grow a variety of vegetables to eat and to sell. Husband and wife Jabulisa Ndlovu and Zuzeni Nyathi used to struggle to find enough for their children to eat, but Zuzeni says: 'We [can] now eat every day at any time – we are always full."

This Christian Aid Week, bite back at hunger and give a gift that will help people living in poverty

out of poverty. £1.85 could pay for 1kg of sugar bean seeds for a family like Jabulisa and Zuzeni's, giving them a crop of 20kg of beans. £2,000 could pay for a sand dam for one whole community like Jabulisa and Zuzeni's, helping them to have a constant supply of water.





a gentle approach to painful feet

A Lock Of Hair!





In the Badsey Society Archive we have a box of papers relating to Rev.

W.C.Allsebrook, Vicar of Badsey (1903-1945). In this box we found this lock of hair belonging to Mr. A.H. Savory.

Arthur Herbert Savory (1851-1921) was born in London. His father was a wealthy goldsmith of Huguenot descent. As a small boy, the

family moved out to Chertsey, Surrey. His first school was in Rottingdean, E.Sussex and then he went to Harrow School. In the 1871 census he was listed as a student at Cirencester Agricultural College. He arrived at Aldington Manor in 1873, just 22 years old, to farm for the first time. He left the farm in 1901 and moved to Burley in Hampshire. In 1920, Mr. Savory wrote a book called 'Grain & Chaff from an English Manor' about his farming experiences in Aldington. He was inspired by Gilbert White's eighteenth century book on life in the small village of Selbourne, Mr. Savory writes about the people on the farm, customs, language, farming practises & the history of Aldington and the surrounding villages. It is a wonderful resource for anyone living in the villages today that are interested in the country way of life. He involved himself in all matters concerning the Parish of Aldington, Badsey & Wickhamford, Mr. Savory personally helped to fund the building of the present Badsey School. He supported the Church & the successive Vicars. As a friend, Rev. Allsebrook, hearing Mr. Savory was ill, requested this lock of hair, Sadly, Mr. Savory died the following month. It seems a strange request to us now but then it was common practice to keep such a memento.
