Letter For The Month

From The Revd Anne Potter

Curate's Contemplations...

The British weather is the most talked about subject probably because of how often it changes and its unpredictability. As I sit contemplating the June letter in the parish magazines across the benefice the sky out of my office window is totally blue, not a cloud in sight, and of course the sun is shining. However yesterday it was wet, windy and cold and no doubt this blue sky will be covered in cloud soon. One thing we can be sure of in Britain is the changeable weather.

For me, however, there is one certain thing that is not changeable or unpredictable and that is God, as revealed through Jesus Christ. Like the weather there are many discussions around the very existence of God and I would recommend an extremely acod book if you are at all interested in such matters - "Unapologetic, why, despite everything Christianity can still make surprising emotional sense" by Francis Spufford. It is beautifully written by a gifted writer in 21st century 'speak' (with some strong language). Spufford does not try to give a rational account of Christian beliefs. emotion and feelings he eloquently explains how it works and what Christianity is, rather than what it is not

Spufford confronts the big issue of how can there be a good and loving God in this cruel suffering world. He does not come up with an answer because we can't make sense of it all - so there. Then he goes on to say the important thing – that Christ, God himself, is right there in the middle of it all with us, not least in the sordid, unexceptional brutality of the crucifixion.

Spufford's does not even try to prove or disprove the existence of God. He concentrates on what he does know, which is the effect Christianity and the life of arace has, chiefly on him, "I assent to the ideas because I have the feelings; I don't have the feelings because I have the ideas."

And so may the grace of God be with you all and let's hope we have some sunshine and warmer weather this British 'summer'.

Badsey W.I

Our meeting in May was our AGM and Resolution Meeting and we were pleased to W.I. Advisor, Anne Smith, from the Federation to take these twoin-one meetings. Mrs Elizabeth Cudd stood down as President after serving for three years. Dee Windle thanked Elizabeth on behalf of the members for her hard work and enthusiasm during her term of office. Mrs Stephanie Hartley was elected as our new President and will be supported by an unchanging committee with the exception of one member.

Our Resolution for this year is about the Decline of our High Streets, which is a big problem for many towns, especially Evesham. Much of it is due to online shopping and of course the large supermarkets where you can now get everything you need under one roof, i.e. foodstuffs, chemist, optician, dry cleaners, photography developing, clothing, electrical goods, furniture, mobile phones, banking etc. most at lower prices than the smaller suppliers and of course they offer recycling of carriers, batteries, ink cartridges etc. Our councils are not reducing rent and rate charges for the smaller shops and we are not getting the range of shops we would like. Car parking charges are another issue. We have so many charity shops, mobile phone shops, nail bars; pound shops etc. but clothing shops, children's shops, greengrocers, gift shops, hardware stores etc are in small supply. We are all urged to use what shops there are available and to lobby our councils and planners to give more thought to the regeneration of our High Street, especially taking in the facts on car parking charges and rents and rates for smaller businesses.

In the interval a bottle (bottles of anything, sauce, vinegar, shampoo etc – not just 'booze') tombola was organised by Angela Gash and raised the tidy sum \$51.00 for our funds and was enjoyed by all who spent generously. The competition for an item beginning with the letter 'E' was won by Win Skitt with a lovely glass elephant.

We are to visit Buckingham Palace on 21st August to view the state rooms and Her Majesty's Coronation dress and robes designed by Norman Hartnell. The visit is open to non members.

Sheila Taylor is our AGM delegate taking place in Cardiff in June and will be taking our votes with her. The speakers for that day include, William Shawcross – Chair of the Charity Commission; Griff Rhys Jones – comedian, actor, presenter and author; and the renowned author, journalist and broadcaster, John Humphrys.

In June we will be holding our annual Garden Meeting at the home of Marianne and Chris Beddis on Wednesday 12th at 7.00 pm. Members to meet at the Village Hall for 6.45 pm so that we can take as few cars as possible. Caring Hands

Dianne Bennett from Caring Hands has asked that a big thank you be given to the people of Badsey for their generous donations of groceries, toiletries and other items.

Caring Hands is ten years old this year and their help for needy people of the Vale has grown and arown. More than ever in this economic climate help is needed for those who are struggling on low incomes, debt and benefit issues, long term illness, homelessness and street homelessness. Referrals by the different agencies have increased greatly with up to 25 referrals a week being sent during November and December 2012. In the ten months leading up to February of this year 231 food parcels, 172 family food parcels, 61 Christmas Hampers/gifts, 99 toiletry packs, 74 family toiletry packs, 194 Cleaning/laundry/toilet roll packs, 15 backpacks, 23 sleeping bags, 35 items of bedding, 31 amounts of clothing and 11 tents have been distributed to those in need. Some families are having to live in B&B places and many people have been made redundant, lost their jobs or have been victims of burglary, muggings, domestic abuse, marriage or partnership breakdown, bereavement mental health issues and many more dire situations.

You can see that the need is greater than ever and all your donations are helping someone somewhere in the Vale. So please keep your donations coming by leaving them in the Church and a very big thank you for your generosity at a time when most people are having more of a struggle with price rises etc.

When I was browsing our archive, I came across this delightful poem written by Henry (aka Harry) Sadler a few-years before his death in 2003. He was born in Badsey in 1916 and was a market gardener all his life, for many years at Claybrook Nurseries, Bretforton Road. It not only gives us a view of Badsey in the past, but perhaps time to reflect on life today.

"We met & we married a long time ago We worked long hours, when wages were low No TV, no wireless, no bath, times were hard Just a cold water tap, and a walk in the yard No holidays abroad, no carpet on floor. We had coal on the fire, and didn't lock doors Our children arrived – no pill in those days We brought them up without State Aids They were safe to go out & play in the Park Old folk could go out for a walk in the Dark. No Valium, no Drugs, no L.S.D. We cured all our ills with a good Cup of Tea No Vandals No Muggery there was nothing to rob. We felt very rich with a couple of Bob. People were happier in those far off days Kind and caring in many ways. Milkmen & Paper Boys would Whistle & Sina A night at the Pictures was our mad Fling. We all got our trouble & Strife We all had to face it, twas the Pattern of Life When I'm alone & look back on those Years I don't think of bad thinas, trouble & tears I remember the Blessings, our Home & our love, We shared them Together So Thank God Above."
