Badsey Flower Show Announces 2013 Line-Up



One of the Vale's most popular village shows – described by ITV television as 'one of the best of its kind' - has announced the line up for this year's event.

The 111th Badsey Flower Show takes place on Saturday 27th July on the Recreation Ground, Sands Lane, Badsey, near Evesham.

Highlight of the show will be a professional sheepdog display by David Seamark which examples the skill, commitment and the capability of working farm dogs. The performance will include the dogs skilfully driving a flock of geese and it will also give children an opportunity to get involved.

The show will also include a flypast by a vintage Dakota aeroplane from the Battle of Britain Memorial Flight (weather and RAF commitments permitting).

The 2013 Badsey Flower Show will also feature musical theatre from Vital Statistics Theatre Company, a fun dog show, the Shirley Pipe Band, outdoor go-carting for kids and a large marquee of exhibits from local amateur growers and producers – something that is always a popular event highlight. In addition, the traditional mix of stalls, side-shows, children's games, and a variety of food and drink will all be in place.

Committee Member, Adrian Barradell explains, "Last year we had a stunning Spitfire flypast and the show was also featured on the ITV programme, 'My Tasty Travels with Linda Bellingham'.

"This year we will be showing yet again how the Badsey show really is one of the best of its kind with the usual mix of professional and amateur entertainment plus a wide mix of stalls and side shows.

"So put the date in your diary or on your kitchen calendar now".

Gates open at 1 pm. Entrance costs ± 3 (or ± 1 for kids and ± 2 for OAP'S) and the event ends at 5pm.

Letter For The Month

Dear Ali,

The news over the past few weeks has seen continued tension following the murder of Lee Rigby in Woolwich, riots on the streets in Turkey, and a continuation of the troubles in Syria. It has also seen the meeting of the G8 in Ireland. At the time of writing my letter news has also come to us that the Bishop of Worcester's wife Denise Inge has recently been diagnosed with what appears to be an inoperable abdominal sarcoma, leaving them facing a very bleak if not utterly hopeless prognosis. It raises the auestions where is God in all of this? And why doesn't He (or She) intervene? This is of course a long standing question which scholars have debated over many centuries without coming to a satisfactory answer, and a reason that many have ceased to believe in a God at all. The past few weeks have also been a time when in the cycle of bible readings to be read on a daily basis we have been reading from the prophet Job. If you know little about the Prophet Job the main subject is the perennial problem of innocent suffering. Job rejects the (then) traditional view that suffering is as a result of sin, and throughout all his trials Job remains faithful to God and realises that, just as he accepts the good things from God, so must he also accept the bad. He does however at one stage come to curse the day that he had

been born. His 'friends' come to try to console him and sit with him in silence, but in the end they do little more than 'kick a man while he is down' (and then get rebuked by God). Perhaps their sitting in silence was what was required and the best they could offer. At times all that we can do in such circumstances is to sit in silence alongside the person concerned; at times words only make things worse.

In such circumstances we all feel inadequate and don't know what to do or to say, and as Job's friends remind us, it is often better to say nothing but just be there for someone. Being silent doesn't necessarily mean doing nothing - at times all we can do is offer silent prayer for a person or a situation. That I feel is all we can do at this present moment as we silently pray for all those caught up in violence throughout the world, for the people of Syria and Turkey, for the world leaders and particularly for Denise Inge. Bishop John closes one of his recent letters with these words: Pray, too, for grace and strength, courage and hope for both of us, and particularly for our beautiful young dauahters, through this dreadful time... We keep faith in God's goodness and throw ourselves on his mercy. Amen to that

Reading through previous parish magazines (available on www.archive.badsey.net) we can discover what was going on in the village a number of years ago. Exactly 60 years ago this month we can read how Badsey & Aldington celebrated the coronation of the Queen. For Badsey the report reads:

Appropriate to the solemnity of such an outstanding occasion, the two church services in the morning were very well attended. Later the children had sports, a sit-down tea in a large marquee on the recreation ground and various entertainments. More permanent

commemorations are the sets of swings on the recreation ground and at Horsebridge Avenue. People over 60 attended a sit-down meal in the schools and gifts were sent to those in hospitals and homes. A buffet was open to all those not otherwise catered for, and a dance in the schools in the evening was well attended.

Clearly the organisers were keen to involve everybody. Unfortunately neither set of swings have lasted as long as the Queen's reign, with the set at Horsebridge Avenue disappearing first.

For Aldington the report reads:

During the morning villagers were able to view the coronation on a television set which had been installed in the Mission Hall. The afternoon celebrations began with an open air service, after which the 'well turned out' fancy dress contestants were judged. Sports for all ages were then held in the Mill Meadow. The children were presented with toffee filled coronation mugs by the oldest resident, Mrs Reeves.

It is easy to forget that many people in those days did not own their own TV set. I doubt if any Badsey or Aldington resident fits into this category now. It would be interesting to know how many 'children' still have their coronation mugs - I know the toffees will have long since disappeared!
