2 Letter For The Month From The Revd Richard Court



September is already upon us and summer holidays are just a distant memory for most of us, I wonder where the time goes (or is that just my age?)! A new academic year is here and all of our youngsters will

have to undergone a major change in their lives. For some it will be the first time at a new school, college or university; for others a new class and different teacher; every year brings a new start and a new challenge. It is only as we grow in years that this constant change normally starts to slow down and for many there is a feeling that there is no longer any change in life at all everything, every day, is much the same as vesterday. For others there is a feeling that the world is changing quicker than they can cope with and they long for things to 'slow down'.

Life is different for everyone, and I thank God for that, what a dull and dreary place the world would be if life was the same for everyone, There is however always the temptation especially when things do not go the way we want them to, to imagine that we have the 'weight of the world' on our shoulders and that no one else understands our problems or our situation - which is of course true - no one can ever fully understand our problems and concerns. It would be trite and insensitive to say 'cheer up there is always someone worse off

than you' because we are the ones who have to deal with our own problems and concerns on a daily basis. It is in Matthew Chapter 6 (in what is known as The Sermon on the Mount) that Jesus teaches his disciples to pray what we now know as The Lord's Prayer, and a little further on in the same chapter Jesus tells them not to worry when he says "Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink, or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food and the body more than clothing?" He goes on to say that your heavenly Father knows all the things you need. If prayer is not your thing and I know many find it difficult to pray, it is not difficult - honestly it doesn't need to be cleaver or articulate; if fact Jesus tells us elsewhere not to try to outdo one another in prayer but to pray silently and tell God the things that are on your heart and mind. So whatever lies ahead of you this coming month, whether it is a new challenge, or it is an issue which is difficult, try offering it to God in prayer. It is something as Christians we can do and while you are offering prayer for your own needs, give thanks for the good things in life - because even at the darkest moments there is always something that we can give thanks for. I will certainly be praying for all those who face challenges this coming month.





United Church Choir

In the olden days when young men were still being drafted for National Service they were asked to state their religion. I answered smartly "Christian Corporal!" only to be told in no uncertain terms that in the Army there was no such category. This question was asked, I soon realised, merely for the organisation of Sunday Church Parades into C of E, R.C, Methodist, etc. this list also included "other".

I was reminded of this on Sunday 12th May when a Christian service, devised by a Methodist Minister, held in an Anglican Church (All Saints) with music led by a choir from all local Christian denominations, marked the beginning of Christian Aid Week. We sang a traditional praise song from Africa, an arrangement of Carter's 'When I needed a neighbour' and an anthem by the current organist of Worcester Cathedral, Peter Nardone, 'I give to you a new commandment' which wove in the ancient text and plain song tune of 'Ubi Caritas'.

We Christians may sometimes differ with our heads but when we sing together our emotional conviction is one. Evesham is unusual, possibly unique, in having a churches' choir which crosses denominational barriers. It meets for periods of three to four weeks at a time to prepare for two or three occasions per year. These in the past usually have been ecumenical events organised by the Churches Together in Evesham and District (CTED). In October we shall be singing an Anglican Evensong in St. Leonards Church, Bretforton. Further in the future we may celebrate John and Charles Wesley or sing a mass. We unite in singing Christian music and together learn respect and better understanding of each other's traditions. At least we have stopped killing each other!



Badsey Society

When Clive Payne asked the Badsey Society for help in solving a mystery from his past, little did he envisage the journey of discovery he would take. Clive, who lives at Redditch, is a descendant of the local Stewart family. He remembered a story of when his father and mother were courting they had carved their initials onto a bridge near Aldington. They were staving at the time with Clive's father's uncle and aunt, Percy and Evelyn Harrison at Blackminster. Clive sought out the help of the Badsey Society. And so started the search of every bridge in the area for a trace of the initials. Clive, assisted by Richard Phillips and Will Dallimore, narrowed the search down to 'Cuckoo High Bridge', a railway bridge between Aldington and Offenham. This tall blue-brick built structure, well known by locals, sadly yielded no answer to Clive's quest, and the search goes on.

Clive's involvement with the Badsey Society was not totally without some good news, as Clive was presented with a DVD containing photos and documents outlining the history and ancestry of the local Stewart family from the 16th century. This DVD having been compiled by one of the Society's many genealogists, Peter Stewart.

Clive was not the only one to seek help from the Society, as the BBC contacted them in connection with their 'Who do you think you are?' programme. As a celebrity from the next series is related to the Crisp family of Badsey.

This autumn the Badsey Society is offering every parishioner the opportunity to trace their ancestors. With talks, and workshops, the Society will help them get started on putting down roots to their own family tree. (See forthcoming events).
