



6 Parish Council News

Horsebridge Avenue-Play Area.

The Wychavon Youth Bus is due to make regular visits to Horsebridge Avenue, the first being on 31st October 2013.

Wheelie Bin Stickers.

Wheelie bin stickers will shortly be available to all residents. The stickers will say either 'slow down' or '30MPH'. The stickers will be at a central village collection point. Further details to follow.

Birmingham Road-Midgeley Dene.

Changes have been agreed with Worcs County Highways to signage and speed limits on Birmingham Road at Midgeley Dene travelling from Blackminster. The number of signs will be reduced to avoid confusion and the speed limit will not include the short stretch of national speed limit on the bend. The process has begun with speed checks and then public consultation before the changes come into force.

Aldington Junction (B4510)- Offenham Road.

Badsey & Aldington Parish Council have met with Highways to look at solutions to the issues with visibility when leaving Aldington onto B4510. Highways are now looking at the cost and feasibility of a number of suggestions including:

- a. Vehicle activated warning signs
- b. Painting the road with more warnings
- c. Extending the 40mph speed limit from Offenham to Evesham
- d. Asking Network Rail whether they could dismantle part of the brick wall

In the meantime Network Rail have erected a mirror which has alleviated some of the issues.

Woodland Trust Trees.

Free trees from Woodland Trust will be arriving in Badsey between 4th and 8th November 2013 for planting around the village by local groups. Badsey School children are due to plant trees at Recreation Ground on Friday 15th November 2013, thank you to them for their hard work. Please go and look at their hard work.



Christmases long ago. Were they more exciting? We all seem to have such wonderful memories and tales to relate of walking as a family together to the village carol service when nine lessons and carols would be held. Shaking the rector's hand as you left church and wishing him Happy Christmas, was always a ritual that had to be practiced at home before going into the service. Then there was the school Christmas party. That rakes up memories of little competitions to see who could make the best hat out of a sheet of newspaper and three dressmaking pins. The visit of Father Christmas at the close of the party always filled one with hope that in Santa's sack there was always a present for you. Christmas Eve found mothers in the kitchen, baking endless sausage rolls, and mince pies. Christmas Day produced a huge roast turkey dinner, with sprouts and parsnips as the main vegetables, with Christmas pudding and custard for afters. The longing for snow to fall heavily on Christmas Eve hardly ever materialised, and so Christmas Day remained a damp day, and sometimes warm temperatures, or a dry windy, cold day. Boxing day was always hopeful for cold and frosty weather, when you could go for a walk, and see the local hunt meeting at one of the inns. It was a day for aunts and uncles to visit and stay for tea, followed by a game of cards and a glass of sherry. Turkish delight sweets, figs and nuts always seemed in abundance during the festive season.
