

# **Celebrating 100 years**



In 2009, 1<sup>st</sup> Badsey Brownies celebrated forty years since their unit was opened in 1969. In 2014, the Brownies will be celebrating 100 years since Brownies

was first formed in the UK. Look out for articles from them over the coming months about what they have been doing. They would also like to thank the community for their support since they were formed and look forward to sharing the fun they have with you. Until then, here are some facts about the Brownies over the last 100 years. Perhaps some of you remember taking part when you were a Rosebud or Brownie.

1914 A section for girls, aged under 11, called

Rosebuds, was formed so that young girls could share the fun and excitement that their older sisters were having at Guides. **1915** Rosebuds were renamed Brownies. Brownie patrols were given the names of British trees and the Brownie motto "Lend a Hand" appeared. As part of the war effort, Brownies crocheted woollen mittens and knitted neck wraps for the soldiers.

**1917** Interest badges were introduced and divided into 4 groups: character and intelligence, skill and handicraft, service for others and physical health.

**1918** Brownie patrols were renamed sixes with each six named after a mythical woodland creature.

**1922** A ceremony for the "Taking of Wings" or "Flying Up" was published for Brownies moving up to Guides.

**1927** The Brownie First Class test was rewritten. This was the highest award a Brownie could achieve before she went to Guides.

**1932** Brownies celebrated the 21<sup>st</sup> birthday of guiding. They held gift services, donated flowers and eggs to hospitals and gave grocery parcels to poor families.

The Big Birthday

**1939** At the beginning of the Second World War, Brownies living in towns were evacuated. Many of them joined new units in the countryside and leaders kept in touch by writing letters.

**1953** The Golden Hand test was introduced.

**1957** Baden-Powell centenary year where Brownies did 6 world good turns on the theme of "Houses of Today and Tomorrow."

**1964** Brownies turned 50 years old. To celebrate they carried out flower good turns by adopting church gardens, planting bushes, weeding gardens, "de-daisying" lawns and sending flowers to those who were sick.

**1968** Brownies had a new Promise and Law. The previous Brownie tests were replaced by the 8 point programme.

**1970** Brownies took part in the 3 cheers challenge to celebrate the Diamond Jubilee of guiding – cheer themselves up, cheer someone else up and cheer up a place.

**1979** In International Year of the Child, Brownies were challenged to find out

what it was like to be a child in a different country and get to know children in their own areas.

**1984** During the Brownie 70<sup>th</sup> anniversary, there was a national Brownie tea-making fortnight where each Brownie aimed to make 30 cups of tea for the public.

**2003** The Brownie Adventure was launched with Brownie Adventure and Adventure on books along with new interest badges.

What is it?

Can I have my event listed on Fridge Dates?

Yes, any organisation or person in the Vale of Evesham can have their event listed on Fridge Dates.

How much does it cost to list my event?

It is free, to list events simply send the details of your event, plus a contact name, number and email address to fridgedates@ourbenefice.org.uk.

How far ahead can I place my event onto Fridge Dates? As soon as you know about it! You can send events up to a year in advance. However, your event may not show on Fridge Dates until a month or 2 before as we only display 1 or 2 pages at any one time.

#### Can I update my listing once it is published?

Yes, especially if your event is sold out or cancelled, all listings can be updated simply by emailing fridgeupdates@ourbenefice.org.uk, updates may take up to 48 hours to appear on Fridge Dates.

Can I print Fridge Dates to display on my organisation's noticeboard?

Yes, however please be aware that Fridge Dates is updated daily, so printed copies may go out of date quickly. Can I put a link to Fridge Dates on our organisation's website?

# Letter from The Bishop of Wocester

The new year is a time for new beginnings and this new year is very much marked by new beginnings in

the Diocese of Worcester. At 4pm on 5<sup>th</sup> January the Revd Nikki Groarke will be licensed as the new Archdeacon of Dudley at Evensong at St Thomas's Church, Stourbridge; she will be installed as an Honorary Canon of the Cathedral at Evensong two weeks later - 19<sup>th</sup> January, St Wulfstan's Day.

Nikki comes to us from London where she was Vicar of St. Stephen's Church in Canonbury, Islington. It is a vibrant inner-city church with two large social action projects supporting marginalised adults and young people. She grew up in Worcestershire, and was a pupil at Flyford Flavell Primary and Pershore High schools. Then, after gaining a degree in modern languages, she worked as a Marketing Manager in the publishing industry in Oxford for ten years, and as the Bereavement Service Coordinator for an Oxford hospice. She has been involved in training and development of clergy in various diocesan roles, and has worked with the mission organisation CPAS and New Wine network of churches.

As I said when her appointment was announced, Nikki is an exceptionally gifted priest with a wealth of experience both within and beyond the church. She has the added advantage of having grown up in this part of the world and this is, in a sense, a homecoming.

By the time you read this an announcement will also have been made from Downing St about a new Bishop of Dudley. I can't reveal his identity at present - it might be considered an act of High Treason. However, I can say that I am equally delighted about this appointment. He will be consecrated Bishop at St Paul's Cathedral on the Feast of the Annunciation, 25<sup>th</sup> March, and be formally welcomed into the Diocese at a service at

St Thomas's Dudley at 4pm on Saturday 3<sup>rd</sup> May. He will be installed as an Honorary Canon in the Cathedral at Evensong the following day, Sunday 4<sup>th</sup>

These appointments come as a relief to me personally as life is more than usually demanding without either a Bishop or Archdeacon of Dudley. I might add that I am very grateful to all those, particularly the Archdeacon of Worcester and the Assistant Bishops of the Diocese, for helping with an exceptional burden during these vacancies. However, these appointments are not just a relief, they are exciting. I believe that God has called two exceptionally gifted people to this Diocese in order to help us to fulfil our vocation to become Kingdom People. The Kingdom People Vision which we are now embracing is another new beginning and it is a Formulated after crucial one. extensive consultation it seeks to enable us to become people whose every breath and action proclaim the Kingdom of God where Kingdom values of love, compassion, justice and freedom reign. I look forward greatly to working with the new Archdeacon and Bishop - and with all of you - to see that vision realised so that we may see what we pray for, that God's Kingdom would come here on earth as it is in heaven.
