"Mayday, Mayday, Mayday"

Mayday, apart from being the first of May, is an international emergency procedure word used as a distress signal in voice procedure radio communications derived from the French expression "venez m'aider", meaning "come help me", the last two syllables of which sound similar to "Mayday". It is used to signal a life-threatening emergency primarily by mariners and aviators, but in some countries local organisations such as police forces, firefighters, and transportation organizations also use the term. The call is always given three times in a row to prevent mistaking it for some similar-sounding phrase under noisy conditions, and to distinguish an actual Mayday call from a message about a Mayday call.

How often do we often do we call out to God "come help me"? For many people it is often the only time they pray and perhaps deep down they are looking for some form of divine intervention to help ease the situation.

When I was pondering this letter it was the beginning of Holy Week and the image of Jesus calling out in his pain to his heavenly father came into my mind. God did not take

away his son's pain but he was there with Jesus in his suffering. In the death of his beloved son on the cross God answered the mayday cry of humankind "come help me" and in the resurrection of Jesus he fulfilled his promise of new life.

When Jesus was challenged in the week before his death about the lack of divine intervention to release him from the pain to come, even right up to the point he was hanging on the cross, he remained steadfast and silent. Why? Because he knew God was responding to a Mayday call from the heart of humanity and it was only through his death and resurrection the message of God's overwhelming love could be revealed. When we are suffering and we call out to God "come help me" our pain may not be taken away. God, though, understands and knows about pain and suffering and, if we turn to him, will be there comforting and sustaining us through the difficult times in our lives.

To quote from the opening verse of Psalm 121 which is one of my favourite Psalms "I lift my eyes to the hills, from where will my help come? My help comes from the Lord who made heaven and earth".
