Dear All, As I sit in my study writing this letter in the middle of what is Christian Aid week, the sun is shining (make a note of that as we may need to look back later in the year and realise

that this 'is summer' !!), the birds wake us up at the crack of dawn, God is in heaven and all is well with the world. That is until we look at the television or read the newspaper and realise what else is happening around us; the plight of refugees in Syria; the unrest in Ukraine; the breakdown of talks in the Middle East; the kidnap of hundreds of school girls in Nigeria. These of course are just the headlines that readily spring to mind and there are many more that could be mentioned with just a moment's thought. We might think that these issues are all far away and do not directly affect us, and then I look at the headlines of the Journal to see headlines of 'fury as shop is forced to shut'; 'latest foodbank due to open tomorrow' - these local issues are not on the same scale as the devastation around the world and the millions starving in Africa, but behind every headline there is a personal story – a person or a family directly affected and they will go on suffering long after they have dropped out of the headlines. Meanwhile as I sip my coffee and continue to look out of the window at the robin perched on the fence I wonder how to make sense of these

If nothing else please think of one particular area and remember them in your prayers. If you don't pray, perhaps I could ask you just pause for a moment, think, and remember.

Police News

Since March 1st to 10th April 2014, West Mercia Police have received 37 calls from residents in Aldington and Badsey. This has resulted in 9 crimes being recorded. They vary from 2 Burglaries of other buildings, three thefts of/from vehicles,1 theft from open ground and two acts of criminal damage with one theft of a pedal cycle. "South Worcestershire Safer Neighbourhood Teams (SNT) have been experiencing an increase in reports of theft of pedal cycles. Owners are asked to take a photo of their cycle, record it's serial number and request their SNT for a "Traceable Item" sticker to wrap around their frames. The sticker has a space for them to write their post code on and once wrapped around the tamper proof film protects it so there is a possibility if found it can be returned to it's rightful owner. There have also been a spate of theft from motor vehicles in neighbouring SNT areas, again residents are requested not to leave lap tops, Satnavs or wallets in their vehicles overnight. A Plurality of Parishes

Up until the incumbency of Rev. Charles Phillott in Badsey (1807-1851), vicars could serve concurrently as many parishes as they wished. As a non-resident vicar he relied on a succession of nine assistant curates to run his Badsey and Wickhamford parishes. Under this arrangement vicars could earn a considerable income. Phillott, as well being vicar of Badsey and of Wickhamford also held Frome in Somerset, Kingston Deverill in Wiltshire and East Teignmouth in Devon, where he spent most of his time. He was also chaplain to H.R.H. Princess Charlotte, the eldest daughter of George III. Although Phillott had an annual income of over £1,000 from his various positions, he died insolvent, probably because of the crash of a family banking business in Bath.

During his period of office Acts of Parliament changed the rules and vicars were only allowed to have two parishes that were no more than three miles apart. After Phillott's time, vicars held Badsey and Wickhamford in plurality until 1996 when the latter parish was joined with Broadway.

The Vicar of Badsey and of Wickhamford immediately before Charles Phillott was Rev. George William Auriol Hay Drummond, a son of the Archbishop of York. In Badsey from 1785, he was concurrently Vicar of Brodsworth and of Doncaster in Yorkshire and Prebendary of York. He wrote a number of works based on his father's writings and also an eclogue (pastoral poem) about Edinburgh. A contemporary in that city called him a "notoriously dissolute clergyman" who wrote "between visits to prostitutes" ! He died in a shipwreck in a fierce storm off of Bideford, Devon, when sailing to Greenock, Scotland in 1807.
