#### AN EVENING WITH THE SLADDENS OF **SEWARD HOUSE**

## LETTERS FROM A BADSEY FAMILY IN

On Friday 12th September at 7.30 pm in St James' Church, members of The Badsey Society will read letters written in 1914 by the Sladden family of Seward House. The entrance fee is £2.50 for members and £5 for non-members; proceeds will be split between The Royal British Legion Poppy Appeal and The British Red Cross Society.

At 11 pm on Tuesday 4th August 1914, Britain declared war on Germany. None of the Sladden family were in Badsey at the time. Julius Sladden was with his youngest son, Cyril, visiting his sister in Folkestone, Eugenie Sladden was on holiday in Wales with her daughters, and the other three sons were in London. George Sladden, a civil servant, was a member of the Territorials and was actually at training camp when war was imminent and was recalled to London. On the day after the outbreak of war, Julius wrote to his wife:

#### My dearest wife

I am rather in hopes we may hear of George's whereabouts in the morning. I can quite understand that you are perturbed at the thought of possible dangers ahead for him and perhaps others, but cheer up, little wife, it is well that our children should be ready to play a part for their country in the face of grave danger and whatever may befall; we could not wish it otherwise. The attitude of the country seems admirable.

He continued with the letter the next day, saying:

I heard from Jack this morning and am glad to learn that he hopes to join you after all. It seems that George is encamped at Somerset House but the

battalion is likely to go on to St Albans soon. With respect to your suggestion about laying in coal and flour, I do not think it right in the national interest to join in the rush for stores, neither do I anticipate that we shall pay much, if any more, a little later. Much love to you dear and to all the others. I am sure you will all keep brave though anxious hearts.

On 6th August, Arthur joined the Royal Army Medical Corps and a few days later, Cyril joined an Officer Training Corps camp prior to enlisting with the Worcestershire Regiment. Jack remained in his job at the Civil Service but enrolled with a volunteer Rifle Corps. Mrs Sladden and her daughters returned to Badsey towards the end of August and immediately began contributing to the war effort. By October, Ethel, the third daughter, had become a Voluntary Aid Detachment at Abbey Manor Hospital in Evesham, and May, the eldest daughter, wrote to her sister, Kathleen, in London:

I have had a lot of children coming and asking for wool to make scarves, socks and belts since Ethel left. They have been making things in the village school it seems, but have now finished them, so they are coming now for materials which we buy with the Red Cross money we have collected. I have had to get a lot more wool, our stock was nearly exhausted. I must go out presently and do about half a dozen village errands. Mother does a good many each day, but that still leaves some for me. What with Red Cross, Soldiers' Wives, Girls' Friendly Society, old women and other sundries, there is no end to it.

Please come and join us on 12th September to find out more about the events of 1914 through the eyes of a Badsey family.



#### Dear All


