2 Thought For The Month From The Revd Richard Court

Dear All,

You will see in the magazine information about new patterns of worship in the Parish. This is as a result of the retirement of The Revd Richard Evans from Cleeve Prior and The Littletons. There are fewer people offering themselves for full time ministry in the Church of England and therefore there is a shortage of clergy or vicars. The Diocese of Worcester is no different to other Dioceses across the country in having to make changes in the number of vicars they have available to them, and unfortunately the idea of there being a vicar in every parish has not been a reality for a long time, in fact there are very few vicars anywhere that only have one parish.

All this means that I will no longer only be the Vicar of Badsey with Aldington, Offenham and Bretforton and Rural Dean of Evesham but I will also have responsibility for South Littleton and Cleeve Prior (albeit in the short term on an informal basis until the legal formalities can be sorted out). Because of this change and the extra workload it imposes I now have a Parish Administrator (Wendy Stafford) to help with administration work; so please do not be surprised if when trying to make an appointment to see me or to book a Wedding

or Baptism etc you are contacted by Wendy who has access to my diary and emails.

On a more sombre note as I write this letter I see breaking news on my phone regarding the hostage situation in and around Paris following the murder of innocent people in the name of Islam. I hasten to say that this is not in the name of Islam, it is in the name of extremism and terrorism and the atrocities have been condemned by Islamic Leaders locally and from around the world. As the Church of England in Worcester we invited an Islamic Leader Imam Hamid Qudoos Hashmi from the Dudley Central Mosque to talk to us at a meeting in November regarding the situation then in Syria and the surrounding areas. Imam Hashmi spoke movingly of how he had been reduced to tears at Friday Prayers when he heard of the atrocities being committed by 'Islamic State'. He went on to say: "The actions of 'IS' are affecting us all and Christians and Muslims must work together to tackle the situation". We must all work together in the cause of Peace and please be assured that these extremists represent neither the Islamic faith nor Muslims in general.

Sheila Lancaster, a well loved wife, mum and grandma. Sheila also played a huge part in church life at St James, Badsey with Aldington as a Licensed Lay Minister (Reader). Sheila led many funerals and met families when planning the funerals and kept in touch afterwards. Sheila set up a bereavement group where folk could meet, sing hymns, ring handbells and have a cup of tea and a natter. This group still meets today under the name Round Robin. Sheila organised many innovative services and persuaded many people to be part of this worship. I remember Palm Sunday processions with a donkey. Sheila went on BBC Herefordshire and Worcester to ask for the donkey.

Sheila was my special friend. We had a few holidays and many days out together which were always fun and full of laughter. Sheila would buy good quality handbags and I would buy cheap earrings. We enjoyed chatting and debating many topical issues over a cup of coffee.

I visited her when she moved to Chinley, Derbyshire, and spoke on the phone almost every day and she would tell me about her village and quite often news about Badsey that I had not heard!

When Sheila was diagnosed with Ovarian Cancer early in 2014 she continued doing what she enjoyed, despite enduring some very difficult chemotherapy treatment. Sheila went with the family to the theatre, visited Pete, her brother in America, came back to Badsey to see friends, went on a trip to Cardiff with an overnight hotel stay and of course shopping for good quality handbags!

"Every day she was positive, an inspiration to us all, she never loses hope." (Words written by her granddaughter Sophie) I visited her a fortnight before she died, as usual she was smartly dressed. I found her very calm and accepting that her life was nearly over but full of that hope of which Sophie spoke. She asked how everyone was in Badsey. Her Christmas present to me was was a red and white bobble hat which I enjoy wearing on cold mornings when I walk down to morning prayer.

God bless you Sheila, may you rest in peace and rise in glory.

The Bishop of Worcester has asked that, as a result of the retirement of The Revd Richard Evans from the Benefice of 'Cleeve Prior and The Littletons', that The Parishes of Badsey with Aldington, Offenham and Bretforton begin to work informally with the Parishes of South Littleton and Cleeve Prior until such time as a formal joining of the Parishes can take place. The result is that as from the beginning of March 2015 there will be some minor changes to the patterns of worship; these are shown below in the 'New Pattern of Services for the Month'. The Parish of North & Middle Littleton, because of the theological differences regarding the Ordination of Women, is not part of this change and they continue to be pastorally cared for by The Bishop of Ebbsfleet.

The school community returned from the Christmas holiday refreshed and raring to start a new term. This term's topic across the whole school covers learning about Rainforests. The children are learning about different aspects of the Rainforest and each class in Key Stage 2 are learning about different rainforests in the world. Dog and Litter bins.

Following on from the successful competitions at Badsey First School and Blackminster Middle School to raise the awareness of the issues in the villages with both litter and dog fouling, a review of both types of bin are to be carried out. This will look at the locations and spread around the villages and whether they are in the most suitable positions and whether more are required. More details will follow.

Village Computer Club

The Parish Council is looking into a scheme in conjunction with Opportunity Vale of Evesham and Broadway URC to provide a regular computer club in Badsey. The first stage is to find out whether firstly there is anyone who would be interested in attending the club and secondly, whether anyone would be interested, with support, to run the club. There is no minimum or maximum amount of places and you wouldn't need to sign up to a set number of sessions. It would be on subjects that are relevant to you, whether that is how to turn on a computer or surfing the net or ordering your shopping or something more complicated!
