

New volunteers save our summer show!

The Badsey Flower Show - one of the Vale's most popular village shows is all set for success this summer after a number of volunteers stepped forward to help.

The event has been running for well over a century but in recent years the number of people organising and running the show diminished.

Without new helpers for 2015 this much-loved traditional event was very likely to close down.

In late 2014 committee called on local people to get involved.

An open meeting last November invited people from the village and surrounding area to come and find out more.

The meeting was a great success with well over 30 new potential helpers attending – more than enough to save the show.

Committee Chair, Gordon Boon explains, "Badsey Flower Show is a not for profit event, run by community volunteers for the village and for the community.

"Over recent years a number of our committee members and helpers had grown old and less able and one or two had left. We were therefore, very keen to attract some new people.

"We were absolutely delighted that at our annual AGM in January we were able to welcome seven new committee members and a number of helpers. I'd like to say a huge thank you to everyone who has come forward. We are very grateful for the response."

"We are delighted to announce therefore, the date of the 2015 Badsey Flower Show - which is **Saturday 25th July.**

Put the date in your diary or on your kitchen calendar now.

New Badsey Flower Show committee member Jenny Davenport said, "I noticed the recent call for help in the local media and, as a new villager, I was keen to find a way to get involved in the community. I also thought it would be a great shame if the show closed so I was very happy to ask 'what can I do to help' and now I've joined the committee."

This summer's show as in previous years, will take place on the Recreation Ground, Sands Lane.

Event organisers promise the usual mix of great live entertainment along with an array of stalls and sideshows.


The 1st Badsey Scout Group has now secured sufficient funds to commence some of the alterations to the Scout HQ.

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ARTHUR PLANT WINS TONY JERRAM AWARD



He thought he was going to a Quiz Night but, when 87-year-old Arthur Plant accompanied his daughter, Linda, to Badsey Community Sports & Social Club one Friday evening, he found

a room full of Badsey Society members waiting for him. It might have been unlucky for some on Friday 13th February, but it was lucky for Arthur who was this year's winner of the annual Tony Jerram Award. The award is given each year to someone who has contributed greatly to the community of Badsey or Aldington.

Arthur has helped with many charity events during his life, including calling bingo at the village hall, but it is primarily for the extremely successful quizzes he organized for over 20 years at The Round of Gras, raising over £35,000 for the Air Ambulance. He was also an active member of the Round of Gras Friday Club. In the 1970s, Arthur ran the local ladies' football team, winning both league and cup.

With the exception of two years in the Royal Navy on National Service, Arthur has lived all his life in the Vale. He was born on Old Post Office Lane, Badsey, moving to Wickhamford when he was ten days old, and then back to Badsey. He attended Badsey Council School and Prince Henry's Grammar school.

He and his wife, Dolly, recently celebrated their 65th wedding anniversary, having married at St Leonard's Church, Bretforton, on 7th January 1950. Arthur and Dolly moved to Aldington in 1951 where they still reside to this day.

The Tony Jerram Award was presented at the end of the Annual General Meeting of The Badsey Society, at which Maureen Spinks was re-elected as Chairman, Valerie Magan as Secretary and Tony Wood as Treasurer. Will Dallimore, Ian Gibson, Tom Locke, Jane Neill and Gill Woods were re-elected as Committee members; Alan and Shirley Tutton were elected to the Committee for the first time. Retiring Committee member, Richard Phillips, was presented with lifetime membership of the Society. After a break for drinks from the bar, there were short talks by Terry Sparrow, Valerie Magan, Tom Locke and Will Dallimore.

Our speaker in February was our Mr Terry Sparrow of Badsey. Terry is a very well known villager and is a legend for his knowledge of Badsey. Terry has written and cowritten books on the village and is a very active member of the Badsey Society. His talk was on "Old Buildings of Badsey" and he began his talk with 'The Mill'. This in the mid 1700's was a corn mill and the mill was later obtained by a silk manufacturer from Coventry who changed the mill into a Silk Mill in the early 1800s. The Mill is no longer there. Terry went on to talk about, The Stone House, The Seyne House, where the Monks of Evesham were sent to recover from illness or disease, the Old Vicarage and many more. It was a most interesting talk which whetted our appetite for more information on these buildings. Our knitting group are still knitting items for premature and stillborn babies, baby clothes and blankets to be sent to the impoverished people in other countries and for prisoners for their new babies. Our Curate Anne Potter has left us to take on a benefice of her own and is had a farewell service on 1st March at Offenham. 
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Thank You from Revd. Anne Potter

Thank you to all those who contributed to the wonderful gift of an "Old English Triple Oil Stock" inscribed with 'I' for Infirm, 'B' for Baptism and 'C' for Chrism. For those of you who aren't sure what this is it is a portalbe container which has three compartments linked like a screw top into which three different oils are placed. The Oil of the Sick ('I') is used for annointing people who are very ill, the Oil of Baptism ('B') is used for annointing someone who is being baptised and the Oil of Chrism ('C') is used in confirmations, annointing people of being ordained and in an act of consecration when something is made holy or 'set apart'. This last one is not used very often by ordinary priests like myself - it is used a lot more by Bishops. Fresh oils are blessed every Holy Week by the Bishop. In our case the Bishop of Worcester. The Chrism Eucharist, when these oils are blessed, usually takes place on Maundy Thursday, but because Bishop John is the Queen's Almoner and has other duties on Maundy Thursday the service takes place on the Monday of Holy Week...day after Palm Sunday. So this year I will be able to put my oils into my new container. I shall treasure this gift in the years to come and no doubt each time will remember the happy years Mike and I spent in the Vale. I was also given a cheque which will be put towards something else to use in my ministry as a continual memory of the very happy time when I served the parishes of Badsey with Aldington, Offenham and Bretforton.

Some of our Y5 children have recently returned from their residential visit to Rue in Northern France. They all had a wonderful time taking part in activities such as the zip wire, crate stacking,



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EMERGENCY DEFIBRILLATOR (AED) INSTRUCTIONS FOR USE

In the event of a suspected cardiac arrest, the following procedure should be used:

- 1. Call 999 and ask for the Ambulance
- 2. When asked by the operator, please give the telephone number from where you are calling and the location of the cabinet. Which is:

Cabinet No. 862
Spar Store
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Badsey
WORCESTERSHIRE
WR11 7EW

- 3. The operator will ask a series ofquestions which you will need to answer to the best of your ability. This will only take a moment and will NOT delay the ambulance.
- 4. The operator will then provide you with the access code to open the cabinet.
- 5. The defibriator and resuscitation pack should be removed from the cabinet and the ambulance service will stay on the line and give verbal instructions if required.
- 6. Switch on the defibrillator and it will then provide you with verbal instructions for use.
- 7. The defibrillator CANNOT be used incorrectly as it will only deliver a shock to the patient if it detects it is necessary.
- 8. There are scissors in the resuscitation pack to assist with removal of clothing and a pocket rescue mask for use with ventilations in CPR.
- 9. If you are unable to unwilling to give ventilation, simply do 'hand only' chest compressions.

Remember THINK safety.

Look around before pushing the button to shock and SHOUT the command SAND CLEAR SHOCKING and check to make sure everyone is clear.
