# Parish Council News

#### **Verges in Aldington**

The Parish Council has just agreed a contract to cut verges either end of Aldington on a six weekly basis between Worcester County Council cuts.

#### New Homes Bonus

It has been confirmed by District Cllr, Mark Goodge that New Homes Bonus is due to be reinstated. Further details will follow advising of the amounts available, when the funds can be applied for and where to obtain an application form. Even if you have applied for funding previously, further applications can be made.

#### **Badsey Recreation Ground**

- A number of branches will be taken back from two trees so that they do not interfere when Badsey Rangers are playing football.
- Quotes are being obtained for a small paved area around the scout hut to make access easier.
- A sign is being fitted to the tubular metal seating area in the play area advising not to climb on seating. This is following a couple of reported incidents with children getting their legs stuck. This piece of equipment has been checked and meets safety requirements and is not faulty.
- Replacement wooden strips are being fitted to the bank in the play area.

Don't forget......Village walk /cycle ride on

#### Sunday 6<sup>th</sup> September Walk leaves at 10am to 10:30am.

There will be 2 versions of the walk. A shorter one about 3 miles (4.5 km) in length taking 1 1/2 hours to walk and a longer one of about 5 miles (8 km); 2 1/2 hours.

Both routes will take in Badsey and Aldington. The longer version will include Wickhamford. The walks will be along public footpaths where possible, through fields, alongside Badsey Brook and between houses, but there will be some stretches along roads. The terrain will be mostly flat but there will be stiles to climb over. Some sections will be muddy after rain.

Route instructions will be provided and, to add interest, there will be some questions to answer along the routes.

Children under 13 must be accompanied by adults. In fields containing livestock alternative routes will be provided for those with dogs, which should in any case be on lead. Suitable clothing should include boots or stout shoes and waterproofs, dependent of course on the weather.

#### Cycle ride leaves at 11.00am

A gentle ride for all the family with a choice of distances 10, 20 or 30 miles.

Please wear helmets and suitable clothing. All children under 13 should be accompanied by an adult.
