The only cost to you would be you fare to and from Germany. If you wish to go or have more details please contact Alex Christision at partnership@ourbenefice.org.uk



The Badsey Society Welcomes Professor Stephen Badsey to talk in his ancestral village

One of the foremost military historians in the country, Professor Stephen Badsey of The University of Wolverhampton, was invited by The Badsey Society to give a talk in his ancestral village. Stephen Badsey is Professor of Conflict Studies in the Department of History, Politics and War Studies, and Co-Director of the First World War Research Group. He is an internationally recognised specialist on the history and present practice of wartime propaganda and military-media relationships. He has held research positions at the Imperial War Museum and for the BBC, and for several years he was a member of the academic staff at the Royal Military Academy Sandhurst. He has written more than a hundred books and articles. He appears and advises frequently for television and other media, and advises for academic, defence and governmental organisations. In the last five years he has been invited to address audiences in Denmark, Germany, Japan, South Africa, Estonia and the United States – and now he has been to Badsey.

As part of The Badsey Society's latest project, "Badsey, Aldington and Wickhamford – a rural community's view of the Great War", Professor Badsey was invited to share his vast knowledge of the First World War. The talk he gave was entitled: "Regulars, Volunteers and Conscripts: The Worcestershire Regiment in the First World War". The Badsey Society has gained funding from the Heritage Lottery Fund through its *First World War: then and now programme,* and is organizing a series of lectures and events in conjunction with the project.

Families by the name of Badsey lived in Badsey until the end of the 17th century. It is almost certain that Professor Badsey is descended from one of those families. As a child growing up in the West Midlands, his parents would often take a detour via Badsey. He was thus honoured to be invited to speak in what he considers to be his home village. A number of Professor Badsey's relatives, likewise all descended from the 17th century Badseys, were in the audience.
