After the business part of the meeting, the annual Tony Jerram Award presentation was made. The award is given each year in memory of the late Tony Jerram (1937-2008), the first Chairman of The Badsey Society, and is given to somebody who the members feel has contributed to the good of the local community. For the first time ever, a

posthumous award was made. At its meeting in January, the Committee was unanimous in deciding that the late Richard Phillips was the worthy winner. Richard died suddenly in October at the age of 67 and his loss has been keenly felt. Richard's partner, Lizzie Noyes, and son, Will Phillips, were present to receive the award from Mrs Barbara Jerram.

Following an interval, Brian Smith, the Aldington poet, and Will Dallimore entertained the assembled group with Brian reading from a selection of his poems and Will providing light-hearted banter. For members of the audience who were Badsey born and bred, it was a real trip down memory lane.



Our knitting group are doing sterling work and had during 2015 and now for 2016, knit blankets, jackets, teddies, baby clothes, scarves and hats for orphanages abroad, very premature babies, blankets for the elderly and disabled. We had three very successful Lent Lunches in the Churches at Badsey, Bretforton and Offenham and will be holding them again in March 2016. Our annual Christmas service had raised money for Winston Wish. Winston's Wish is the leading childhood bereavement charity in the UK. They offer practical support and guidance to bereaved children and their families. A New Year Lunch at the Fish and Anchor in Offenham had been enjoyed by all.

Our members are not all mothers, or even all women. They are single, married, parents, grandparents, or young adults just beginning to express their social conscience. Mothers' Union has members in 83 countries across the world. These members seek to serve people in their communities through outreach projects and various programmes. In South Africa this may mean using the spare land next to the local church to start a vegetable garden. Produce from the garden is then used to feed families who are affected by HIV/AIDS and who come each week to share a meal and give mutual support to each other.

Across the UK members run crèches and craft groups in prisons. They help families to maintain contact and enable children to see their parents in a safe and supportive environment.

Members run 'Away from it All' holidays that give families the opportunity to have quality time together - families who desperately need a break and some extra support.

**True:** British radical thinker and author Thomas Paine was involved in both the American Revolution and the French Revolutioin. Paine served on a US Congressional Committee and was elected to the National Convention in France despite speaking no French. His 1791 book, Rights of Man, is regarded as a core text in the study of radical thought.
