When I was eighteen years old my dad and I decided to go to France and visit the places where some of our ancestors are buried after being killed during the First World War. The thing that impressed itself so vividly on my mind was the sheer scale of the military cemeteries. Then we went to the memorial at

Theipval, which records the names of over 72,000 British soldiers who went into battle in the region of the Somme between 1915 - 1918 and were never seen or heard of again. I was completely awed by the magnitude of the sacrifice made, and very deeply moved.

This year we have commemorated the 100th anniversary

of the Battle of the Somme. On the 13th November services held all across the country will remember all who have died in war, but no doubt there will be a special thought for those who died in the First World War. Each

Visit 18-22 August 2016

In August eight members of the 'Bridge' English/German Partnership, ranging in age from 15-70+, spent five days with host families in and around Halberstadt, an area which was formally part of East Germany.

Some of the group had been to Germany with the Partnership many times over, but for my 15 year old daughter, Rebekah, and myself this was our first visit. We initially became involved with the Partnership two years ago following a request in the Community News for host families. As a result we had hosted Elke and her teenage grandson, Silas, when the Partnership visited in November 2014. We were therefore delighted to find ourselves staying with Elke and her husband during this August's visit.

Although our visit was comparatively brief, we did manage to cram a lot in. We spent a day in Wittenberg, birthplace of the Reformation, visiting the Castle Church where Martin Luther nailed his 95 Theses to the church door in October 1517. (Next year will be of particular

significance as it will be the 500th anniversary). The following day we travelled to Meissen, famous for its porcelain, and visited both the cathedral there and the palace of Albrechtsburg, one of Germany's oldest castle, which stands on the same site. On the final day we visited the rock dwellings carved into the hillside near

Halberstadt; these are very similar to the Holy Austin Rock Houses at Kinver in Staffordshire.

As well as all the trips out, there were meals with our hosts, shared worship and time to socialise. Before leaving, we presented our German friends with a glass plaque depicting a rainbow and a bridge symbolising the 'Bridge' partnership which had been specially made for the occasion by Wendy Stafford, our Benefice Administrator. For me, the whole trip was very memorable, but three things will always come to mind when I look back: accidentally going into the Gents with another female member of the group whilst we were in Wittenberg (very embarrassing!); seeing a plane at Leipzig airport taxiing over a bridge across the motorway right in front of the coach in which we were travelling (very bizarre!); and wearing humungous slippers to walk on the polished wooden floor at Albrechtsburg (the whole group looked so comical as we half shuffled, half skated along!)

An Evening with the Sladdens of Seward House – Letters from a Badsey Family in 1916

On Friday 9th September, St James' Church, Badsey, was again the venue for a reading of letters from a family who lived in Badsey a hundred years ago. "An Evening with the Sladdens of Seward House – Letters from a Badsey Family in 1916", followed on from events in 2014 and 2015 covering letters written in 1914 and 1915. The performances form part of The Badsey Society's latest project, "Badsey, Aldington and Wickhamford – a rural community's view of the Great War", which has gained funding from the Heritage Lottery Fund through its *First World War: then and now programme.*

Members of The Badsey Society played the parts of the Sladden family. Patsy Miller, who is the great-niece of Julius Sladden, the patriarch, returned to play his wife, Eugénie, and her husband, Anthony, played the part of Julius. Other members of the cast included Will Dallimore, Ross Davies, Martha Morrey, Jane Neill, Robin Neill, Mellangell Roe-Stevens, Chris Smith, Sandra Sparrow, Terry Sparrow and Tony Spinks. The script was written and produced by Maureen Spinks.

This year's event began with Arthur Sladden serving in France with the Royal Army Medical Corps, George Sladden in France with the Civil Service Rifles and Cyril

Sladden with the 9th Worcestershire Regiment on the Gallipoli peninsula. Several members of the Sladden family (the grandchildren and great-grandchildren of Cyril Sladden) were amongst the audience.

Rwanda 2016 by Katie Richards

In August, I went on a Girl Guiding UK project to Rwanda with 5 other Girl Guide leaders from the UK. We delivered training sessions at the Girl Guiding HQ (AGR) in Kigali and visited schools within the country.

Troop Leader Training

Our training sessions with Troop Leaders consisted of looking at how to start a troop in their area; which in Rwanda they do within schools during club time along with how to recruit new members into their troops within the schools by positively speaking about Girl Guiding. We then discussed their fundraising ideas and made action plans of how they can successfully put their ideas into fundraising projects in the future. We spent a morning teaching them about safety and first aid within a guide meeting covering aspects of first aid including cpr, the recovery position, bandages, slings, and animal bites.

Youth Committee

We spent two days with the AGR Youth Committee where we explored small project designs linked with fundraising creating ideas that included putting on talent shows and competitions. We helped them think about recruitment and retention in different aspects such as local, district, regional and national recruitment drives and how to keep a girl within Girl Guiding once she has finished school and no longer has access to Girl Guiding in club time.

Schools

Over the 3 weeks on project we visited 8 schools in the country. We visited schools of all ages where we spent time teaching them songs and games that we do in our units back home. The numbers in our sessions range from 50 girls to the whole school taking part which consisted of 200 children! That session was a mixture of 'how loud can 6 Guide leaders shout?' and 'Can you spot all 6 Guide members?' but it was successful and they were all so excited. One afternoon we also visited an SOS Children's village which was an amazing experience to see how happy we made them after spending two hours with them leaving smiles on their faces.

Onward travel

After project, we stayed in Rwanda and went Gorilla trekking in the Volcanoes National Park Mountains where we were 2m away from the Gorillas in their natural habitat. It took us two hours to walk up the Mountain to find them and then we stayed with



them for an hour before hiking back down. We met the Mufunzo Gorilla group who has lots of cheeky juveniles who were very entertaining and cheeky running past us beating their chests to show off! Within the family there were two one-year-olds and a one-month-old baby who we stood 2m away from in his mother's arms.

I had a brilliant time on my Guiding Overseas Linked with Development (GOLD) project working with over 800 Girl Guiding members and local children! If you would like to find out more, you can find us on Facebook under 'GOLD Rwanda 2016' and read our blogs from project

It has been brought to notice that two other men from the village also lost their lives on the Somme in the October of 1916 as did the Grandfather of Gordon Hill one of our regular ringers. We offer our strength and thanksgiving in the knowledge of their courage which was given for us in the name of Jesus Christ.

Normally a half muffled peal takes place for 'Armistice' on the eve of the Commemoration but due to ill health and of course the aging factor it may not be possible this year.

As we move forward Christmas will be the time for Celebration where hopefully one of our newest ringers will make their debut
