The weekend itinerary also included a road trip to Weston-Super-Mare and visits to a selection of gardens that participate in the National Garden Scheme.

A special Eucharist service was conducted at St James church by Archdeacon Robert Jones. At the end of the service sung in both English and German, the leader of the German group presented Reverend Philip Morton with a gift as a mark of appreciation of the partnership shared between the two church groups. The Reverend Thomas Henry Hunt,

Vicar of Badsey with Aldington, and Wickhamford, 1852 to 1887

Born in 1826 and educated at Eton and later Christchurch the Reverend Hunt arrived as the vicar of Badsey in 1852. Just 26, he was dismayed to find Badsey church dilapidated, there was no organ and the surrounding churchyard was witnessed as a place for grazing sheep.

Putting his energy into the challenge before him, Reverend Hunt formed a choir and until there was money available to purchase an organ a harmonium was provided. It was during those difficult early years that Reverent Hunt developed an interest in farming, acquiring a poorly drained and neglected area of Glebe land which he cleared and restored to prime condition. One of Reverend Hunt's sons tells how generous his father was at harvest time, allowing 'gleaners' – people who collect leftover crops after the land has been harvested, '*to pick up something worth their while*.'


In 1866 the churchyard came under the auctioneer's hammer and was conveyed into the joint names of Reverend Hunt and Joseph Jones, church warden. Joseph Jones some years later was brought before Evesham Magistrates Court for uprooting parts of the yew hedging that formed the southern boundary of the churchyard. He was fined £1 and asked to pay damages and costs estimated at 11s 6d.

Reverend Hunt's ambition to refurbish Badsey church received a boost after receiving a considerable inheritance. Supported by Mr. Savory (Aldington Manor) as fund treasurer, raising fund for Badsey church began in earnest. In 1885 the church was closed and restoration work began. A churchyard wall was constructed that today marks the boundary that faces the village High Street.

In 1887, Reverend Hunt retired and left Badsey. He died in 1896. In memory of his devoted ministry, a stone cross was erected outside Badsey church porch and dedicated by the Archdeacon of Warwick in 1910.
