WHAT'S HAPPENED TO OUR CHURCH CLOCK?

On 11th November last year, after the commemoration of Armistice Day, our church clock fell silent, even though it keeps its time. A reliable clock that has served our community well. In 1902 a "Clock Fund" was set up by the church for a new clock, that would cost £128. Parishioners were keen to offer generous donations to the Fund because Westminster chimes would be added. Julius Sladden of Seward House, paid one guinea towards the clock and two guineas towards the Westminster chimes.

Two new bells were purchased for the church belfry: one of them was for striking the new clock. In January 1903 the new clock with Westminster chimes was installed. Then, both clock and bells were dedicated by the Bishop of Worcester, who walked to St. James church, from Badsey vicarage. After addressing the congregation, the Bishop proceeded to the belfry and dedicated the clock and two new bells, saying prayers suitable to the occasion.

For many decades our church clock has been a trustworthy timekeeper, and a reliable source for knowing the time. It's now 115 years since it was first installed, and it has served us well. Down the lanes, or walking around the village, we know the time because the Westminster chimes and the hourly strike are heard. Until now. So what's gone wrong?

Well, In 2012 the winding system for the clock was automated. The system installed has electric motors which rewind the weight via steel wire attached to a drum with a pulley to the weights. During a recent inspection it was found that the wire for the hour strike has started to fray and strands of wire had broken. The advice from the clock company was to switch off the strike rewind to allow the weights to return to the floor until such time as they could get an engineer to us.

So, whilst we wait and wait and wait for an engineer, don't forget, for the time being, you mustn't rely on hearing the reassuring sound of our church clock......

ALDINGTON CONNECTIONS



Aldington - what a lovely Worcestershire village. Through connections with the church, it is attached to our much larger village of Badsey. Aldington has had various spellings and pronunciations over time, but now we appear comfortable with the name Aldington.

During the time Aldington was a "berewic", or corn farm, belonging to Evesham Abbey, Abbot Randulf had a grange built there. Aldington is mentioned in the Domesday Survey of 1068.

The aristocracy seem to have enjoyed living in Aldington Manor; maybe it offered stability and a feeling of togetherness amongst parishioners. In 1531, when Aldington was called "Awnton", a Richard Yardley left in his will, amongst other things, "To the Chappell of Awnton, one hog, one strike of wheat, and one strike of barley". The will seemed to imply there was a chapel of worship in Aldington, however it disappeared and over time, Aldington churchgoers were embraced and welcomed in St. James church. They had their own area for seating and their own churchwarden.

The Jarrett family from Aldington, who lived in the 17th Century, were laid to rest in Badsey.

William Jarrett, the eldest surviving son, returned to Aldington after his family died, to arrange an affectionate memorial for his family.

The Jarrett memorial, fashioned from marble, seen here on the right, is on a wall in St. James church Badsey and really worth viewing when you visit church.



Arthur Savory, a farmer who lived in Aldington Manor at the end of the 19th Century, wrote a book about Aldington's history and village life during the time he lived there. It was called "Grain and Chaff From An English Manor". His memories of living amongst the Aldington parishioners, are described with much affection.

When Arthur first arrived in the village, only one side of the road had houses and cottages. The other side offered a wonderful view of orchards. Arthur found the Aldington dialect difficult to understand. He soon realised though, if he learnt how to speak it, communicating with the villagers was a lot easier.
