Somehow we know not to pick them, just observe them and watch them mature. Their pure white petals and sort of oval shaped flowers, pointing downwards from the stem, are like no other flowers in winter.

If we leave them alone, our patience is rewarded with blossoms from January, lasting though into February. Then we begin looking for signs of crocuses and primroses.

Winters Past

As I write this the first snow of this winter has fallen. It caused me to reflect on the winters when Badsey did suffer with heavy snowfall. There were harsh winters in the nineteenth century but in terms of within living memory the winter of 1946-7 seems to have been a particularly bad one (or good one if you like the snow). From late January until mid March, easterly winds drove a succession of snowstorms across the UK resulting in what was believed to have been the snowiest winter since the mid-nineteenth century.

Six weeks of snow, which began on January 23, led to thousands of people being cut off by snowdrifts. As the UK was recovering from the effects of the Second World War, the armed forces were called upon to clear roads and railways of snowdrifts that were up to seven metres deep in places. According to the Met Office record, snow fell every day somewhere in the UK for a run of 55 days. Because the temperature on most days barely exceeded freezing, much of the snow settled. The wintry conditions were suffered in Badsey - do you remember your parents/grandparents talking about it?

The next winter which was particularly memorable for snow was that of 1962-3. With temperatures so cold the sea froze in places, 1963 was one of the coldest winters on record. Bringing blizzards, snow drifts, blocks of ice, and temperatures lower than -20 °C, it was colder than the winter of 1947, and the coldest since 1740. The snow-belt reached southern England on Boxing Day and stayed over the country, bringing a snowfall of up to 12 inches. A blizzard followed on 29 and 30 December, causing snowdrifts up to 6 m deep. Roads and railways were blocked, telephone lines brought down, and some villages were left cut off for several days.

The snow was so deep farmers couldn't get to their livestock. Mean maximum temperatures in January were below 0 °C in several places in southern England, more than 5 °C below average. Mean minimum temperatures were well below freezing. An entry in the Year book for Evesham High School reads, "Spring term 1963: frost and heavy snow in Evesham [and across the country]. A New Year "Party-Dance" for former pupils had to be postponed until the end of

February because of the severe weather (and even then it snowed)." Were you one of these former pupils?



The last substantial snowfall in Badsey was during the winter of 2010-11 when the snow fell during December but fortunately did not linger beyond January. It was, however, recorded by several photographers. We do not know what Winter 2018 will bring us in terms of snowfall but we know that Badsey residents in previous years have coped (without the benefit of central heating and double glazing!) and no doubt so shall we.

A reflective way to begin the day

When the monasteries of Britain were closed nearly 500 years ago, it was envisaged by some that the monastic practice of daily prayer would be carried on in a simplified way by ordinary people in their everyday lives. That didn't happen so much but the seven periods of monastic prayer do still live on as the Sunday services of morning and evening prayer and Holy Communion.

Over the last twenty years, a small group of us have met together at 7:45 every weekday at Badsey Church on our way to work. We take part in the Franciscan office of morning prayer just as it is done in the Franciscan retreat houses. Twenty five minutes later we are out and getting on with the rest of our day with a refreshed vision of the love of God in all things. The short service follows the changes of the church year and includes readings, some simple plainsong as well as a period of prayer for those who have requested it.

If you would like to take part, you might like to try just one day a week for a set period to see if you like it. You might want to leave a prayer request for us on one of the string tickets just on the right as you enter the church.

The prayer requests that some of you have filled in are being included every day and we continue to do so for about a month unless you request otherwise.

Our vicar, Philip, often comes to lead the service on Tuesdays and we alternate who leads on the other days. Others of us do the readings or simply take part in a quiet reflective way. Numbers have varied between three and seven depending on which day of the week it is. The smaller numbers can be as moving an experience as the larger. What we do in the first hour of our day, can have a profound effect on how we live and work for the rest of it.

Exercise-based groups, creative and music therapies can increase confidence and independence, bring relief from symptoms, reduce stress, anxiety and depression as well as improve sleep.
