A Treasured High Street Asset since 1911

Pool House, just down from the Water Fountain in Badsey, gives you a clue to the state of Badsey High Street many decades ago. A large pool of water covered a section of the high street, where cattle and horses passing through refreshed themselves. Gradually, a succession of hygienic measures by the local authorities, enforced a tidy up of this area of the road.

After a public water supply was introduced in 1888 it originally came from the springs in the Cotswold Hills. Today, our water supply comes from areas like The Mythe at Tewkesbury. 1993 saw an enlarged Severn Trent Water company take over from the East Worcestershire Waterworks.

But in 1911, through public subscription, the Water Fountain in Badsey High Street was erected, to supply drinking water for cattle, horses, dogs, and also for the passing public.

The likes of Mr. Julius Sladden and Mr. Charles Binyon, were on the Committee to oversee it all happen. The fountain was built in gothic style using mainly Cotswold stone and the grey bowls were of Handsworth stone.

The front and side water troughs were ideal for horses or cattle, the smaller troughs lower down for dogs to drink from.

On the front panel was the inscription in blue lettering: "This fountain was erected by public subscription to commemorate the Coronation of King George V, June 22. 1911".

In 2017, Badsey and Aldington Parish Council had the water fountain refurbished and it looks very nice.

Unfortunately the blue painted lettering though has been replaced with black paint.

The water fountain is no longer connected to a water supply and stands a treasured High Street Asset for all to admire as they pass by.

My wife, Lyn, and I moved here in 2004 from South Birmingham to be nearer to her parents who lived in South Littleton.

I thought I was moving away from my through and through "Brummie" heritage and from my birthplace of Birmingham, but after joining the Badsey Society and getting interested in Family History, it turns out that I have actually moved nearer to my family's birthplace, and much nearer to some of my distantly related relatives.

It appears from my research, that the family lived in Churchill in Oswaldslow, near Spetchley, and my paternal Great Great

Grandfather then moved to Birmingham in the 1840s.

However, my Great Great Grandfather's younger brother, born in 1807, stayed in the area as a miller, and his youngest son, Jerry, born 1849, became the miller in Wyre Piddle.

Jerry then moved to Aldington Mill as a Corn Miller. Jerry married his wife Elizabeth who was from Bretforton, and had one boy, John and two girls, Annie and Myra.

Jerry and his wife are buried in Badsey churchyard. According to Jerry's Will the family inherited several properties and land, so corn milling must have been profitable. John married Agnes Harris and when the mill stopped producing in 1927 moved to The Laurels, Offenham, his Uncle's house. His daughter, Agnes Elizabeth, got married and Peggy Selby is her daughter.

A MESSAGE TO YOU ALL, THIS MONTH FROM REV. RALPH BOLLAND

Reflections on the "Three Confessions" Conference.

Whilst serving in the Royal Air Force in Germany in 1963, I was privileged to listen to three Lutheran Ministers. In the course of the meeting they explained that it was difficult for them to understand how there could be High Church and Low Church under one Anglican Denomination in Britain.

At the "Three Confessions Ecumenism Today and Tomorrow" conference held in April, there were Lutherans, Anglicans and both English and German Roman Catholics - and me, a retired Free Church minister. How times have changed as we shared the weekend together.

It was good to listen to the ways in which we can share a common concern for our communities around us.

On the Saturday we visited Stourbridge and Stourport to see the work which the combined churches were doing through Food Banks; Debt Counselling; Street Pastors; working with Refugees and Fairtrade activities amongst others.

Putting aside any small differences, we enjoyed the times of church services and also showing concern for the world around us as we prayed together.

We live in a divided world but it was so good to hear English and German voices blended together in one accord as we prayed and worshipped the One True God and Jesus Christ His Son, our Saviour and Lord.
