Safeguarding within the Benefice

We have two new names and telephone numbers added to our PCC contacts this month. These are the details of our Benefice Safeguarding Officer and Safeguarding Advocate.

The Benefice Safeguarding Officer is nominated by the PCC and appointed by the Bishop to carry out safeguarding administration within the benefice.

This includes being the Verifier for DBS (Disclosure and Barring Service) checks, keeping appropriate records, organising training and maintaining regular contact with the Diocesan Safeguarding Administrator.

The Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) helps employers make safer recruitment decisions and prevent unsuitable people from working with vulnerable groups, including children. It replaces the Criminal Records Bureau (CRB) and Independent Safeguarding Authority.

If you have any safeguarding concerns then please contact either the Safeguarding Officer or the Priest in Charge. If it is not appropriate to discuss your concerns with either of these people, then please call our Safeguarding Advocate who is completely independent and will be able to deal with your case. Upstairs Mr. Fred, our telephonist, operated the switchboard with speed and dexterity, manipulating the tangle of plugs and wires with ease.

The busy Workshop could repair all types of agricultural machinery. It was particularly busy in the spring, with lawnmower maintenance a priority.

This is a forgotten age of strict principles and values, where, on my first day at work, it was instilled in me that 'the customer is always right'.

A MESSAGE TO YOU ALL FROM CURATE TIMOTHY HUPFIELD

Hello! My name is Timothy Hupfield, and I'm excited to be writing to introduce myself because at the end of June I'll be joining the benefice as a curate.

This will be my second phase of training to be a priest; at the moment I'm just finishing three years of training at Westcott House, in Cambridge. On 30th June, God willing, Bishop John will ordain me as a deacon and I'll join the benefice to work alongside, and under the supervision of, Fr Philip. (I'll then be ordained again, as a priest, roughly a year later.) I'm really looking forward to being with you all, and getting to know you. In the meantime, so that I'm not just a name, here are a few things about me.

I grew up near Lichfield, then went to Cambridge university to study Natural Sciences (eventually specialising in chemistry). My degree was an eventful time - during it I started going to church, got married, and was baptised! This threw my plans for a PhD and a career in research up in the air. As I stood up to dry my hair at my baptism, I very clearly felt God calling me to priesthood.

That was nearly 14 years ago - it took me a while not to be terrified of the responsibility God was calling me to! Many other wonderful things have happened along the way too: Hannah and I had two children - our son is now 8 and our daughter is almost 4; Hannah trained for the priesthood at Westcott and, after a curacy near Lincoln, became a university chaplain; and I trained as a science teacher, and was then a stay-at-home father until we came back to Cambridge for me to start training at Westcott.

Outside of work and studies I enjoy running, board games and puzzles. Recently Hannah and I have introduced our children to our love of hill walking (fortunately they're also more than happy to walk for miles through mud!) and we've also discovered the free-range treasure hunt that is geocaching.

I'm very much looking forward to moving in June, and to beginning ordained ministry serving and worshipping in the benefice. Timothy

Timothy is to be made deacon at Worcester Cathedral at 2.00pm on 30 June. He will be welcomed to the Benefice on 1 July at a service at 11.00 am, in Cleeve Prior church. All are welcome at these events.
