Have you noticed the wildlife round about you in this hot weather? Reports of grass snakes slithering along the road have been made. On the other hand, frogs and toads are hiding away right now, finding nice damp areas to wait for cooler temperatures at night. Bats flying around at dusk, swooping back and forth catching moths. Herons have been seen in the afternoons, searching for food in dried up fields.

Sands Lane has seen a lot of grass snakes. The snakes have laid eggs in compost heaps, and in heaped up piles of horse poo. The youngsters, as they grew, have shed their outer skins in neighbouring polythene tunnels. Whilst the hot weather continues, the grass snakes have been seen in July, basking in the sun, so that their body temperatures stay comfortably warm enough to keep themselves very mobile when needed.

#### A Message to you all from Reverend Timothy Hupfield,

#### and Margaret Pye, on the subject of Funerals

'Taking Funerals Seriously' was a conference recently held in Worcester. For everyone who went, it made us think about death, dying and funerals - not a subject that many of us feel comfortable talking about. It can be hard to find the answers to questions that we don't want to ask; awkwardness, fear and upset can make it difficult to be able to be fully informed when we find ourselves in the position of attending or organising a funeral.

The conference prompted us to write this article as a conversation-starter about this difficult topic.

Anyone living in the parish is entitled to have a Church of England funeral, regardless of whether they ever attended church or not. Whilst a 'church funeral' suggests a certain location, there is a lot of flexibility in where a service takes place; it doesn't have to be in church. It could also take place in a crematorium, at an outdoor woodland or burial site, or in a cemetery.

The clergy and other licensed ministers are experienced and well trained in pastoral ministry. When someone dies we understand how difficult this can be; we are there to support you, and your family and friends, before, during and after the funeral with compassion, fellowship and prayer, understanding your sadness and loss. We work alongside you to put together the service - each service is unique, and tailored to reflect the life of your loved one. They may include favourite or particularly appropriate tributes, poems, music, hymns and songs. Working closely with the funeral directors, we make sure everything is fitting for this final farewell.

Central to all Church funeral services is a message of hope. Recognising that while death is an end, we speak about God's promise that death is not the end. In death, there is new life in Christ. A new life that is offered to us all; every life is precious to God and, as the Bible says, there is nothing - not our actions in life, nor even death that can separate us from God's love.

Whilst it is a difficult topic to bring up, it may be helpful to you and your family to talk about what you would like at your own funeral, whatever stage of life you are at. There is a helpful website, www churchofenglandfunerals.org that might be a useful starting point. Any one of the Ministry team would also be more than happy to discuss things with you.

#### VOLUNTEERING.....

I always enjoy reading the Community News to find out what is happening locally and was interested in the article on 'volunteering' in August's copy, although I was unsure who had written the piece and therefore who I should contact about it.

I agree wholeheartedly with the points mentioned and have thought for some time about offering to help in the ways suggested. However, the article seemed to stop short of addressing how we actually find out who would welcome some support in our villages and how we link their needs to suitable volunteers? It talks about helping our

'neighbours', with the assumption that we know who is feeling lonely, vulnerable or in need of some support - but I don't! Many of the people who live near me seem to be out and about leading their lives to the full, or have family and friends living close by, but I'm sure there are others in the village who are not so fortunate and I might be walking past their home everyday completely unaware.

# So, how do we make the link between those in need and those wanting to volunteer?

Are there systems within the two villages to do this? Is there a register of interest, for both parties? Or should one be circulated? The importance of 'safeguarding' these days means you can't really approach someone without an introduction and vulnerable people should, quite rightly, be wary of anyone they don't know.

Presumably the Evesham Volunteer Centre has all the systems in place for addressing this, e.g arranging DBS checks and making connections between those in need and any potential volunteers? This is one way around the issue - and where I had planned to go before reading the article. However, it would be really nice to be able to support people in the immediate village community who do not have family living nearby. As the final sentence in the piece suggests, it should be a win win situation: providing support and/or friendship for those in need whilst also helping volunteers to get to know their neighbours (in the widest sense), enabling them to feel they belong and can play a small part in improving the lives of others. I look forward to hearing from anyone with information or ideas.
