A Message to you all from Reverend Timothy Hupfield

As I write, it is the very middle of Advent. In Advent we look forwards to Christmas, to when Jesus was born - the Son of God came into the world, Emmanuel, 'God with us'. We speak of 'looking forwards' to an event that happened long ago - that very first Christmas Day. We wait with expectation and joyful hope, waiting to celebrate something that we know will happen because we know it already has happened.

There is a strange, but comforting, tension of looking forwards by looking backwards. It allows us to reflect on the enormity of the Christmas message. Looking backwards isn't enough, without considering how it might affect our future. And however many Christmases we have celebrated, there is always something new we can learn from the Nativity story that is so well known: Mary and Joseph travelling to Bethlehem; Jesus' birth and him being laid in a manger; angels coming to the shepherds, who then go to visit the new born Jesus. We look back to that very first Christmas Day, and celebrate what it meant for the world then, and means for all of us in the future.

This theme of looking backwards to look forwards carries on into the New Year. By the time you are reading this Christmas Day might be well past (though not the *season* of Christmas, which continues on in the Church's calendar into January). Thoughts may have turned to New Year's resolutions.

Resolutions that look back over the last year, in order to look forwards to the year ahead.

Perhaps the New Year's resolutions have already proved difficult to stick to - I know a fair few of mine have struggled even in the first few days of January in the past. 6th January, which marks the Epiphany, where the three wise men finally reach the stable and visit the Christ child, has often given me a chance to revisit the wisdom of resolutions of the past, to look ahead to the future with more realistic aspirations!

Wherever you may be when you read this, in this season of looking backwards and looking forwards, I hope that you have (or have had!) opportunity to reflect on all that has passed - in your lives, and in Bethlehem all those years ago - and opportunity to look with hope towards all that might lie ahead in the future.

Morning Prayers

A reflective way to begin the day

When the monasteries of Britain were closed nearly 500 years ago, it was envisaged by some that the monastic practice of daily prayer would be carried on in a simplified way by ordinary people in their everyday lives. That didn't happen so much but the seven periods of monastic prayer do still live on as the Sunday services of morning and evening prayer and Holy Communion.

Over the last twenty years, a small group of us have met together at 7:45 every weekday at Badsey Church on our way to work. We take part in the Franciscan office of morning prayer just as it is done in the Franciscan retreat houses. Twenty five minutes later we are out and getting on with the rest of our day with a refreshed vision of the love of God in all things. The short service follows the changes of the church year and includes readings, some simple plainsong as well as a period of prayer for those who have requested it.

If you would like to take part, you might like to try just one day a week for a set period to see if you like it. You might want to leave a prayer request for us on one of the string tickets just on the right as you enter the church.

The prayer requests that some of you have filled in are being included every day and we continue to do so for about a month unless you request otherwise.

Our vicar, Philip, often comes to lead the service on Tuesdays and we alternate who leads on the other days. Others of us do the readings or simply take part in a quiet reflective way. Numbers have varied between three and seven depending on which day of the week it is. The smaller numbers can be as moving an experience as the larger. What we do in the first hour of our day, can have a profound effect on how we live and work for the rest of it.

Etching of Roman numerals X, X1, X11, lead us to imagine 10, 11 and 12 of a clock face. Fascinating isn't it.

Mary informed the meeting that the Xmas meal will be on Wednesday January 16th. at "the Open Door", transport will leave from The Poplars at 12.30 pm. Happy new year to all
