

A Message to you all from Reverend Timothy Hupfield

It may be that things have changed enormously by the time this letter is printed, but as I write parliament is facing unprecedented difficulties; the world is still reeling from the terrorist attack in Christchurch, New Zealand; and climate change seems to becoming an ever more urgent issue. It would be so easy to look around, in the news and at the world, and question how things have somehow gone so horribly wrong.


Now that we are getting close to Easter, it reminds me slightly of how the disciples might have felt in the very first Holy Week, with the whirlwind of Jesus entering Jerusalem, getting arrested and dying on the cross. Their teacher, leader and guide was suddenly gone.

How did things go so horribly wrong?

And yet, Holy Week invites us to enter into the story and emotions of Holy Week, and all the events that led up to Jesus' death. Through Jesus God has stood with us, as one of us, sharing in our pain and our difficulties. We also know, however, that is not the end of the story.

Mary Magdalene met Jesus again, on that very first Easter Sunday, and he appeared to his disciples in the following days and weeks. Through one message despair was transformed into hope, which spread from one woman to fill the whole world.

The mystery of Easter shows us many things. One key thing is that when all seems messy and worrying and desperate, through God hope can be found. The hope comes not through awful things not happening - though God does not cause suffering – but through the love of God being found in the response to broken relationships. We are urged to respond to our broken world through caring for creation (described by God as 'very good'). We are called to respond to broken relationships with each other by standing up to racism, discrimination and hatred in all its forms. We are invited into a renewed relationship with God - every day, but especially as we prepare for and celebrate Easter.



Benedictine Monks

The Anglican Benedictine community of monks and nuns at Mucknell Abbey, Worcestershire, contemplative life under the Rule of St Benedict. The Abbey was built for sustainability on a site of derelict farm buildings and was completed around the end of 2010. To this end, the abbey was built with numerous features to enable and assist the monks sustainable living. The buildings feature high grade insulation to minimise heat loss; the heating is powered by a biomass fuelled boiler. Electrical power is provided in part by photovoltaic panels, and solar water heating panels reduce the use of the boiler during the summer months. In addition to harnessing solar energy, the new buildings also harvest rain water, which is stored in a 5000 litre tank and is used to flush the lavatories and water the kitchen garden; there is a further 45000 litres available for fire-fighting. The wastewater from the site is treated in a bio-digester and consequently the buildings are not connected to the sewage network. Much of the community's vegetables are grown on site in the kitchen garden, and once the orchard has developed, it will further reduce the need to buy in fruits and vegetables. Both the kitchen garden and orchard

are managed using eco-friendly means. So, the monks live in very modern conditions these days.

The community gathers together seven times a day to say or chant the traditional monastic Office and to celebrate the Eucharist. The rest of their day is spent in work, study, private prayer, pastoral support, and in offering hospitality to those looking to share in their life at Mucknell.

Anyone wanting to experience the way of life of the monks are called "Alongsiders". They live with the community for a variety of reasons, ranging from exploring a possible monastic vocation, to a simple desire to experience the monastic life for a while. Alongsiders stay with the community for between one and twelve months and while living alongside are expected to follow the community's timetable and participate in its work.

Eventually, if someone has a strong wish to become a Benedictine monk they eventually take three vows: a vow of poverty which means giving up their worldly goods, a vow of chastity which means they stay single, and a vow of obedience which means they promise to obey the church and the rules of the monastery.



THE BADSEY SOCIETY **TONY JERRAM AWARD**

Despite the wet and windy weather, 54 people attended the Annual General Meeting of The Badsey Society on 8th February. Maureen Spinks was re-elected Chairman, Shirley Tutton was re-elected Secretary and John Sharp was re-elected Treasurer.

After the business part of the meeting, the annual Tony Jerram Award presentation was made. The award is given each year in memory of the late Tony Jerram (1937-2008), the first Chairman of The Badsey Society, and is awarded to somebody who the members feel has contributed to the good of the local

community. This year's winner was Anne Poulter who has run the Badsey Beavers (part of the Scout Association) for over 30 years.

The Chairman said that she could do no better than to read out the words on one of the nomination forms: "Anne is a natural leader and is totally dedicated to what

She brings enthusiasm, fun and is a very caring person. The children think she is fantastic and full of adventure! Anne has a great understanding of children and brings wider experience to Beavers and extra hidden skills that the children don't get at school. She has the ability to relate to all ages and in her 37 years of Scouting has brought enormous benefit to so many lives and inspired so many people.

Anne's interpretation skills are invaluable for the work that is involved in the planning for the large variety of scouting badges that the children aim for during their time at Beavers. Anne is a great supporter of events in Wickhamford too. She is a member of St James' Church, Badsey, and supports children's and young people's activities associated with the church and Benefice.'

Anne was presented with her award by Mrs Barbara Jerram. Anne said that she was extremely honoured to receive the award and accepted it on behalf of all the scouting community.

After the break, Nina O'Hare from Worcestershire Archive and Archaeology Service spoke about a potential archaeology project with which the Society may become involved, and Alan Wadsworth of the Worcestershire Farmsteads Project spoke about a survey which is taking place to record all the surviving hovels in the area.

In order to continue to thrive the club is in need of new players of all abilities.


The club are members of the Cotswold Hills League playing in Division 2 on Saturdays afternoons. You can read about us on Badsey-play cricket website.

Easter Sunday will bring the Great Celebration that the children will have worked so hard to achieve. Well done to everyone.


