##### BADSEY MOTHERS' UNION



We are a group of knitters who knit blankets, garments, twiddle muffs and premature baby clothes which we send to members of the community, special needs schools, nurseries and care homes, 'Bliss' for premature babies and jumpers for teenage boys in the Holy Land. The wool for these items is supplied by us and donations from others. Wool for the jumpers for teenage boys was from monies raised by Badsey Beavers. In 2018 we knitted 25 Jumpers; 14 blankets; 4 scarves; 1 jacket; 40 twiddle muffs; 8 premature baby cardigans and 7 hats. This year our project is the Shoe Box collection – Teams 4 U. We meet once a month for friendship and knitting together. We are a group within Badsey Mothers' Union but if you would like to knit garments for us in your own homes we would be more than happy to receive them.

The **MOTHERS' UNION** is part of a worldwide society which supports and encourages family life. In the Worcester Diocese we help and support new parents; teenage mums and abused women and men. We send very needy families on holidays, knit for both old and young and make gowns for stillborn babies. In Badsey, as well as the knitting, we have raised money for holidays or respite visits for families who need them, money for a fund that helps women, in

mostly African countries, with Literacy and Numeracy to enable them to take control of their lives and families. We have also donated to CWISY a fund which supports local projects in the UK, with things like Parenting Courses, Mums and Tots groups and many others. We have also helped raise money for the Relief Fund which makes monies available immediately in cases of international disasters such as floods, fires, earthquakes etc. We also raise funds by serving a frugal lunch during Lent of homemade soup and a roll to remind ourselves of worldwide poverty and the lack of food some families in the UK experience

**BADSEY MU** meets on the second Tuesday of the month in Badsey Church at 2.30.pm. where we usually have an interesting speaker. We also have outings, quiet days, lunch and tea outings, garden meetings and other activities.

## A Message to you all from Reverend Philip Morton

At the beginning of Holy Week, we witnessed the disastrous fire at the Cathedral of Notre Dame in Paris. As the roof burned and the spire fell, the residents of Paris gathered on the banks of the Seine to watch and mourn the destruction of one of the most famous churches in the world. As one by-stander commented, "It's like watching the heart of Paris being ripped out". Those watching were not just Christians, but people of all faiths and none, demonstrating the emotional power a church building can have on people from every walk of life.

This terrible event served as a dramatic reminder that church buildings have a far wider emotional relationship with communities than just their worshipping congregations. They stand as places of community connection where countless generations of people have been married, have had their children baptised, and have said farewell to loved ones.

They are monuments of history and tradition, rooting us to centuries of everyday life in our villages. Yet the fire at Notre Dame has also opened our eyes to how vulnerable these buildings can be. There is sometimes the assumption that something that has stood for centuries will always be there, but the care and up-keep of our church buildings is a never-ending process. Two churches in our Benefice, St. Andrew's in Cleeve Prior and St. Nicholas' in North & Middle Littleton, are undertaking substantial repairs to secure these buildings for the use of future generations. Without the help of the wider community, vital repairs will not be possible. ### St James the Apostle

Ancient history and religious tradition has brought thousands of pilgrims every year to the Cathedral of Santiago de Compostela in northwestern Spain. Legend has it that the remains of Saint James the Apostle are buried inside the cathedral. For Centuries, thousands of pilgrims every year walk the long and mapped out route to the Cathedral. The most used route is from France. Starting from St Jean Pied de Port, it would take you around thirty five days to walk along the **Camino de Santiago**. You need to be fit, and walk around 15 miles each day. Hikers are advised to prepare beforehand, like get yourself a small backpack with hip strap. You'll need a sleeping bag, trekking poles, a good set of outdoor clothing, hike socks that don't rub your feet and of course comfortable hike boots.

Along the way, you will come across small towns, with hotels and bed and breakfast houses. It's a good hike for over a month though, during which you will walk around 500 miles, but if you start out on your own, you'll never need to walk the long route alone. Companionship with groups or just walking along with one or two others, develops along the way. Once you reach the Cathedral of Santiago de Compostela, your achievement is realized amongst thousands of other pilgrims. It's then a matter of appreciation of what you have achieved, a visit to the Cathedral, and the obligatory photos to capture the reason why you walked over a month, sharing highs and lows with strangers who had the same goal as you: arriving as a pilgrim at Santiago de Compostela.
