Badsey exports stained glass window to the Ukraine!



Last July, Badsey resident, Pat Waters was asked by her nephew who lives in Cherkassy in central Ukraine, if she would make a stained glass window for a church building that had just been obtained by a Mission that he runs. She agreed and waited for a design to be prepared and sent to her. The design was entrusted to Olivia (Liv) Hatcher of the USA. The window is 70 cms high and 120 cms wide; it is formed of four panels so that it could be transported from Badsey to the Ukraine as hand luggage on British Airways.

Key elements of the design include the earth, sun, and sky. This is the largest and most technically demanding work Pat has undertaken. The panels contain about 80 individually crafted glass pieces. The foreground is a series of rolling hills or fields which stretch outward. The different shades of green, which are crafted in varying opacities of glass, are meant to evoke light, shadows, and a tranquil vibration. The central element of the design is the dove floating on the sunburst which is a classical element in Christian spiritual life to represent the Holy Spirit. It has been taken out of what is generally a quite traditional depiction and slightly abstracted. The dove symbolizes peace and constant hope in a quiet way that should inspire reflection. The sunburst placed on a vivid blue sky is also a nod to the yellow and blue of the Ukrainian flag.

The four panels have safely arrived in Cherkassy, and have been united for the first time before being fitted to the window in time for Easter. The window will excite much interest in the Ukraine as stained glass is virtually unknown there. Pat's nephew runs an organisation called "Kreativity" and you can read all about them on www.kreativity.org. (a quote from their website: **"We use business as a tool to create self-sustaining communities. But the world needs so much more than just economic projects, so we are involved in social projects that touch the lives of the poorest around us. And ministry projects, because the key to living on this crazy earth is our Faith in Jesus, and sharing that with everyone around us."**).

A Message to you all from Reverend Timothy Hupfield

It only seems a few weeks since I moved into the area, but the one year mark is fast approaching.

For me, this has the added significance and excitement of meaning that I'll be ordained again, in Worcester Cathedral - this time, as a priest. It's a moment that I have been looking towards for fifteen years, ever since I realised that God was calling me to be a priest.

Part of why this ordination is so exciting is that it is the culmination a long journey, of listening to what God is calling me to be. God's calling won't stop there, but whatever the next step will be, it will be as a priest. It's been a long journey - perhaps that is part of the reason why I have on my ember cards (cards asking people to pray for me as I approach my ordination) the bible quote πιστος ὁ καλῶν - 'the one who calls is faithful'. God calls every one of us, continually and faithfully, to be all that we can be.

The reason why I will be ordained again is that the church has three 'orders' of ordained ministry - deacons, priests and

bishops. Currently, I am a deacon. Each order has a different focus: The ministry of a deacon is one of serving; Priestly ministry centres around the Sacraments (priests can, for example, lead services of Holy Communion), and also pronouncing both God's forgiveness and God's blessing; Bishops have a ministry of oversight.

One of the crucial things about these orders of ministry is that they are permanent - when someone is ordained priest, they do not change from being a deacon to being a priest. Every priest is **also** a deacon. A bishop is also both a priest and a deacon. And so, after my ordination I look forward to serving in these villages, as a priest, for the coming years of my time as curate here.

The ordination will be in the cathedral on Saturday 22nd June at 2 pm - if anyone is free and would like to attend, it would be wonderful to see you. (No tickets are needed, and the cathedral assures me there'll be space for as many people as necessary).

STONEHENGE

Summer Solstice

The building of Stonehenge in Wiltshire remains a mystery to everyone. We are left to wonder who assembled the huge stones, and why they were put there. We all assume they were assembled in several stages and maybe the area is where pre-historic people buried their dead, some 5,000 years ago.

One theory about stone circles has us believe they were built in the late Neolithic era, around 2,500 years BC. The overwhelming theory about the Wiltshire stones is, they were assembled as some kind of worshipping monument.

A "henge" is a prehistoric monument consisting of a circle of stone or wooden uprights.

The original purpose and function of henge monuments isn't fully understood and around these stones in Wiltshire are also arrangements of banks and ditches. So, as the henge in Wiltshire was built of stone, the name "Stonehenge" has been adopted.

Its massive scale suggests that Stonehenge was vitally important to the ancient peoples who built it, but the monument's purpose has been the subject of widespread speculation for centuries.

Recent archaeological digs revealed human bones, suggesting may be a kind of burial area from thousands of years ago.

There is also the suggestion that it has something to do with sun worshipping.

Our modern world with all its technology and advanced science is unable to offer a solution to the hidden mystery of the stones. Tourists flock to the area, hoping they may find reasoning to it all. Access to the area via modern traffic has now been diverted away from the stones and a public transport bus is offered to tourists wishing to wander round the circle of mysterious stones.

A theory is, the stones themselves were transported in some primitive way, from Wales. One thing is for sure. Stonehenge will be well visited this month at the summer solstice, and this year it is Friday 21st June.

Morning Prayers in Badsey church

7.45 am every weekday, Mon-Fri
A reflective way to begin the day

When the monasteries of Britain were closed nearly 500 years ago, it was envisaged by some that the monastic practice of daily prayer would be carried on in a simplified way by ordinary people in their everyday lives. That didn't happen so much but the seven periods of monastic prayer do still live on as the Sunday services of morning and evening prayer and Holy Communion.

Over the last twenty years, the morning prayer service in Badsey Church is for anyone to attend, before they go off to work. It begins at 7.45 am.

The short service follows the changes of the church year and includes readings, some simple plainsong as well as a period of prayer for those who have requested it.

If you would like to come along and take part, you might like to try just one day a week for a set period to see if you like it. Or, if you don't want to attend, you might want to leave a prayer request for us on one of the string tickets just on the right as you enter the church. The prayer requests are often for ill loved ones, or just a prayer that something will go right in people's lives.

Our vicar, Philip, often comes to the service on Tuesdays and we alternate who leads on the other days. Others of us do a reading or simply take part in a quiet reflective way. Numbers have varied between three and seven depending on which day of the week it is. The smaller numbers can be as moving an experience as the larger. What we do in the first hour of our day, can have a profound effect on how we live and work for the rest of it.
