JULIAN OF NORWICH

Julian of Norwich was a religious recluse and lived much of her life in a little cell attached to St Julian's church in the city of Norwich. Nothing is really known about her family, education, or of her life before she became a recluse. It is thought she was born in late 1342, and during her life, she experienced the dreadful effects of an outbreak of the Black Death - a bubonic plague pandemic reaching England by flea infested ship rats. (1348-1350). At the age of around 35 years, Julian had a severe illness and didn't know whether she would survive. Whilst ill she had many visions, or "shewings" of Christ on the Cross. She recovered and wrote a book about her sixteen Revelations (shewings) of Divine Love that she received from the Lord. This is the first book known to have been written by a woman in the English language. She could not study theology, because in her medieval world women were not allowed to pursue higher education. Nevertheless, Julian taught herself to write "Middle English" - (a way of speaking from 12th to 16th

century), with such amazing clarity, and her vocabulary was so good, she has been called "the first woman of English Letters." Julian also developed a mystical theology that was second to none during the fourteenth century. Julian died aged around 73 years. In 2014, a statue of Julian of Norwich was installed on the west front of Norwich Cathedral. The city of Norwich celebrates every year with a wide range of activities, lectures and exhibitions dedicated to her legacy.

The Diocese of Worcester recently announced that the Bishop of Dudley, Graham Usher, is to become the next Bishop of Norwich. He will leave our Diocese at the end of July and will be formally enthroned as the Bishop of Norwich in Norwich Cathedral in the late Autumn.

2019 Village Show turns up the heat!

The 117th Badsey Flower Show takes place on Saturday 20th July on the Recreation Ground, Sands Lane, Badsey, Worcs. And this year the event organisers are promising a hot show!

The main entertainment attraction on the day will be fire performer Simon Chainey. Simon is the founder of FLAME, a group of performers specialising in high-energy street performance fire shows.

Committee member, Adrian Barradell said, "This year's Badsey Flower Show promises something eye-catchingly different with our fire performer.

"There will also be lots of other quality entertainments and this includes a memorial RAF Hurricane flypast (weather and RAF commitments allowing).

"It is a fun, family day out for a very affordable entrance fee."

Other arena entertainment on the day includes The Shirley Pipe Band, United Dance Academy and Badsey School Choir. Also on the showground, will be the usual large marquee of exhibits and a great mix of sideshows, stalls and food and drink. In addition, The Shipston Town Band will play live.

Gates open at 1pm and the afternoon will end at 5pm. Entry costs £3 (or £2 OAPs and £1 children).

We also had a visit from Nigel Huddleston MP who again thoroughly enjoyed his time with us and could see how much the children respect our Badsey Values. Following Mr Huddleston's visit the Year 5 pupils went on a visit to the Houses of Parliament, focusing on the Journey to Democracy – their knowledge of Simon De Montfort stunned the guides at Parliament.

Or, if you don't want to attend, you might want to leave a prayer request for us on one of the string tickets just on the right as you enter the church. The prayer requests are often for ill loved ones, or just a prayer that something will go right in people's lives.

Our vicar, Philip, often comes to prayers on Tuesdays and we alternate who leads prayers on the other days. Others of us do a reading or simply take part in a quiet reflective way. Numbers have varied between three and seven depending on which day of the week it is. The smaller numbers can be as moving an experience as the larger.
