WORCESTER DIOCESE AND ITS PARTNERSHIP WITH THE PROTESTANT CHURCH OF CENTRAL GERMANY



Worcester Diocese is in partnership with the Protestant Church of Central Germany. The partnership link was welcomed by the Magdeburg Diocese after the Berlin Wall came down. Magdeburg is in the Saxony region of Germany and has a beautiful gothic cathedral. The 10th Century Holy Roman Emperor Otto1 and his wife are buried there. Today, exchange visits by people from both Diocese happen. In June we received a Worcester-Magdeburg Newsletter detailing the enjoyment of various recent visits by both Diocese.

In May, church members of Barby parish near Magdeburg spent a long weekend visiting members of St. Michael's and All Angels Stourport Parish Church. There were a lot of places for them to visit, one of them being the Cotswold Falconry Centre at Moreton in Marsh.

Members of St. Barnabas in Worcester visited members of St. Laurentius in Magdeburg and one place to see was a "double church", one end for catholic worshippers, the other end for protestant worshippers.

Another arrangement was for members from St. Catherine's church, Salzweden near Magdeburg to visit Pershore, where a tour round Pershore Abbey was enjoyed. They climbed to the top of the tower to view the surrounding countryside. A tour round Worcester Cathedral was also arranged for them. They went on a boat trip, a visit to Croome Park, and shopping in Pershore. Before leaving, the German visitors from Salzweden invited members of the Parish Centre, St. Andrews, Pershore, to visit Salzweden next year.

Great Malvern Priory welcomed church members from St. Katharina's church, Wolmirstedt near Magdeburg. The Priory received a gift of an altar cloth embroidered with the words "Wolmirstedt 2019". A visit to Gloucester Cathedral was also arranged for them before they returned home.

The Magdeburg Diocese thanks God for the joy of sharing in worship, fellowship and fun together.

A Message to you all from Reverend Philip Morton

August is usually a fairly quiet period in the Church calendar, which makes it an ideal time to reflect on the need for proper rest and recuperation. In the busy-ness of daily life we can often overlook the wisdom of just taking some time to stop and rest, to look around us and enjoy being in the present moment. The Bible is full of examples of this wisdom, starting with the Commandment to make sure we take a proper day off each week ("Remember the Sabbath Day, and keep it holy"), and continuing with the many times Jesus heads off into the wilderness to be alone in prayer. One of my favourite passages from the Old Testament comes from Psalm 127, "It is in vain that you rise up early and go late to rest, eating the bread of anxious toil; for the LORD gives sleep to his beloved". If you ever want an excuse to take a nap, here it is in the Bible! There is also some good evidence to suggest that making sure we get proper rest and recuperation is good for our mental and physical health as well. So, while some recent articles in the news are encouraging us to work ever harder and longer, the Bible implies that finding a good balance between work, prayer and rest is a good path to a more fulfilling life. I hope this summertime will be a period of good rest and peaceful enjoyment for you all.

7.45 am every weekday, Mon-Fri A reflective way to begin the day

For a long time now, the morning prayer service in Badsey Church is for anyone to attend, before they go off to work. It begins at 7.45 am.

The short service follows the changes of the church year and includes readings, some simple plainsong as well as a period of prayer for those who have requested it.

If you would like to come along and take part, you might like to try just one day a week for a set period to see if you like it. Or, if you don't want to attend, you might want to leave a prayer request for us on one of the string tickets just on the right as you enter the church. The prayer requests are often for ill loved ones, or just a prayer that something will go right in people's lives.

Our vicar, Philip, often comes to prayers on Tuesdays and we alternate who leads prayers on the other days. Others of us do a reading or simply take part in a quiet reflective way. Numbers have varied between three and seven depending on which day of the week it is. The smaller numbers can be as moving an experience as the larger. What we do in the first hour of our day, can have a profound effect on how we live and work for the rest of it.
