ST JAMES' CHURCHYARD

Many of our Parishioners who regularly tend loved ones' graves are well aware of the numerous large mature trees that are often a reason for concern and sometimes annoyance.

- Falling brash & branches due to high winds or dead wood landing on or near headstones.

- Dense foliage cutting out natural light and the carpet of leaves littering graves.

The answer is simple:

"REGULAR MAINTENANCE"

Owing to numerous demands on limited church finances, only essential outside work can be undertaken.

Children Learning To Read And Write In School Today



Years ago, we just went to school and were told how to say words and how to write words. No explanation was given. Today's primary school teachers encourage children now in a very helpful way. We have 44 different sounds of our alphabet of 26 letters. The sounds are called "phonemes". Like all languages, there is an agreed way of how we write the sounds down. Primary school children learn to say the sound of a letter, or groups of letters that are written down. Once they've learned those sounds, the next step is to blend the sounds together and read words. Blending means to speak the individual sounds, put them together and say the whole word. Flash cards help.

Simple examples are as follows:

C A T. If children say the "sound" of each letter, blending those three "sounds" together says the word "CAT". M A T. The letter "M" sounds like "m-m-m", so blending those three "sounds" together says the word "MAT".

By practicing and practicing the sounds of letters, then blending them together, primary school children soon recognise simple words.

Gradually, the children learn how pairing up some letters of the alphabet produces different sounds. For example: S H O P. Pairing up the letter "S" and "H", gives the sound "sh". Pairing up "O" and "P", gives the sound "op". They can now blend the sounds and say the word "shop". Learning this way, children don't always need a picture in a book to tell them what the word might say or mean. Bit by bit, and practicing regularly, children soon enjoy learning in a simple and gradual way, how to read and write.
