# SELF-DENIAL OR SELF-DISCOVERY

A message from Rev Philip Morton



The beginning of March sees the start of the season of Lent. According to tradition, this is the season when we try to think of something to give up – chocolate, cake, meat, favourite TV shows – I've tried all of these over the years with varying success!

Of course, the season itself commemorates the time when Jesus went out into the desert for forty days and fasted in preparation for the beginnings of His ministry. Since the earliest days of Christianity, believers have used this season in the run up to Easter as a time for prayer, penitence, self-denial and atonement. Part of the self-denial bit is the giving up of luxuries, which I think most people associate with Lent. But it should also be a time for thinking about taking up something

– perhaps the discipline of reading some scripture each day, or helping out with a local charity.

This year, once again we have some Lent groups meeting in various places in the Benefice. This year we're exploring the musical 'Jesus Christ Superstar' so if this interests you please do look at the notices in your local church for more details. Women of Zimbabwe have prepared this year's service and they encourage us all to reflect on the difficulties and unrest that have plagued their country over many years. They share the challenges they have met and the hopes they have for the future. They encourage us to "Rise, take your mat and walk" with them as they continue their often turbulent journey towards full reconciliation.

World Day of Prayer is an international inter-church organisation which enables us to hear the thoughts of women from all parts of the world: their hopes, concerns and prayers. The preparation for the day is vast. An international committee is based in New York and there are national committees in each participating country. Regional conferences meet to consider the service and then local groups make their plans.

The day of prayer is celebrated in over 170 countries. It begins in Samoa and prayer in native languages travels throughout the world – through Asia, Africa, the Middle East, Europe and the Americas, before finishing in American Samoa more than 36 hours later.

All are invited to St James' Church, Badsey on Friday 6th March 2020 at 2.30pm, where we will gather to celebrate the service prepared by the women of Zimbabwe. You are also welcome to join us for a light lunch, 1pm at the church.

## ARCHAEOLOGY ON OUR DOORSTEP

*Digging this hole, hole in the ground!*

If you ever wanted to try some practical archaeology this a great opportunity to help with a local dig which will be happening in Badsey this May. It is called "Small Pits, Big Ideas II".

Worcester Archaeology Society are to receive money from the National Lottery Heritage Fund to carry out a countywide archaeology project this year and Badsey is one of the 6 villages to take part. It follows on from a successful trial dig in White Ladies Aston three years ago.

The Badsey Society has linked up with WAS to organise a garden "test pitting" survey in the village and is seeking volunteers to offer their gardens and or their services to help with digging, separation and washing of finds.

The Test Pits are to be a metre (3 foot 3 inches) square areas of garden which will be carefully excavated to find all items that have been deposited by human activities since the site was first occupied. Normally this will mean digging down 2 to 3 feet below ground level.

All items of interest will then be cleaned and recorded for a report to be made by WAS. The results will be published and explained in a touring exhibition and public talks around the county. Badsey will get its own talk describing the findings.

The project in Badsey would like to have 20 gardens to excavate and will also need plenty of volunteers to help with the work. It is mainly first come first served and would ideally be gardens spread around Badsey to give a fuller picture for the survey.

The only properties which cannot be considered are very modern ones which will have been surveyed already prior to building and where the soil will be very disturbed by modern construction methods.
