## The Beauty of the Double Cluster By Stargazer

This month's Stargazer brings you two objects for the price of one: the Double Cluster in Perseus.

The Double Cluster is circumpolar, meaning that it can be seen in the night sky throughout the year; but during the autumn it is in an ideal position, nearly overhead during the early evening. If the sky is clear and very dark, you can see the clusters with the unaided naked eye. However, a pair of binoculars or a small telescope will bring out the full magnificence of these two jewels in the night sky.

To find the Double Cluster, first find the "W" or "M" of Cassiopea, also high in the sky during the autumn and winter. Follow a line from Cassiopea towards Perseus, and you should find what appears at first to be a fuzzy grey patch. The two clusters of stars are within our Milky Way galaxy in the major Perseus spiral arm. As the sun is in the Orion arm of the Milky Way, we are looking out from the centre of the galaxy into the adjacent spiral arm when we look at the Double Cluster.

The two clusters of stars are quite close to each other astronomically speaking, being about 6800 and 7600 light years from our sun. Although they appear adjacent to each other from our point of view, they are about 800 light years apart, making them close neighbours in astronomical terms.

Each cluster consists of about 300 bright blue stars with a few red

giant stars. These bright stars are about 1000 times brighter than our sun, and it is because the stars are so bright that they can be seen so easily over this great distance. We know that these stars are quite young, because these large hot stars only live for a relatively short time, in the region of a few tens of millions of years compared with the 10 billion years for stars such as our sun. From the age of the stars in each cluster we can see that they are relatively young, being only about 14 million years old, and this is very young for such a cluster.

Investigation of the light from the individual stars in the clusters shows that the light is blue shifted. That is, the two clusters are moving towards us, and they are moving towards us at a colossal speed of 24 miles per second (39 km/ second)! You will be able to see the blue-white stars with the naked eye, and with the aid of binoculars you should be able to see orange and yellow stars, giving the Double Cluster an almost iridescent quality.

So, during the colder evenings of November, why not wrap up warm, give your eyes a little time to adjust to the dark and try to find the Double Cluster in the night sky. You won't be disappointed as the almost jewel-like quality of the spectacle becomes apparent to your eyes.

## Is there truth to the myth?

Last month, for our Halloween edition, we asked if anyone had any thoughts, opinions or even sightings of the legend that is the

Badsey Panther. We said you have to see it to believe it - and it sounds like someone has!

Speaking about his experience with these big cats, local resident and Community News reader Chris said: "Yes, we have most certainly seen a big black cat three times locally, and that was close to what is known as the old 'burnt track' that runs from Willersey Rd to Wickhamford. My youngest son also saw one once here, but our best view of the beast was close to Little Comberton Church, as clear as could be! It was very near the road, but we couldn't pull over in time. "Both of these sites are in areas inhabited by their favourite prey: roe deer."

Claims surrounding the panther's existence are few and far between, but there are a number of local residents who are certain they've seen a big cat roaming around at one time or another over the last few decades - even as close as Badsey Spar! But is there any truth to the claims?

According to the British Big Cats Society, they have received hundreds of sightings across the Midlands in the last eight years, and experts say these animals - if they do exist - could be the result of big cats being released into the wild around 45 years ago.

Before strict laws were introduced over the ownership of large cats in 1976, animals such as panthers were popular and prized pets. But, when the law changed and expensive licences were required, many of them had to be let go.

Clearly, we do have some dark beasts roaming among us...be sure to keep your wits about you, particularly as the nights creep in!

This month we celebrate Remembrance Day, and over the past few years my wife and I have had the privilege to read out the names of the men from Badsey who died in the two World Wars, and to realise the great sacrifice they made for the freedom of our country. They 'gave their today for our tomorrow'.

As we remember their sacrifice, let us also bring to mind the fact that Jesus Christ, the Son of God, gave His life and died so that we might have salvation and eternal life with Him.

Between the sun, frost, mist and rain in November, the winter rainbows bring a splash of colour. Old man's beard covers the bare hedges like a blanket



keeping it warm and protecting all beneath. Animals grow thicker, closer fur including our domestic dogs, cats and horses, and wildlife is tempted into the open to forage being more easily spotted as their cover is blown away with the fallen leaves of the trees.

In the fields, roe deer and pheasants stroll out in search of their food. Pheasants were first

introduced in the 11th century by the Normans. Although they are artificially reared for sport, now, we have a considerable wild population surviving by their own efforts. The most common male locally is the Lady Amhurst pheasant, introduced in the 18th century with the distinct white ringed neck.

Underneath the water of our ponds and brooks, many types of nymphs thrive on the vegetation ready to emerge next year as dragonflies, damselflies and pond skaters. On the surface of the water, ripe bullrushes give shelter to ducks, moorhens and swans. The Aldington mill pond hosted two mandarin drakes last winter. A welcome colourful visitor!
