Engagement dates will be sent out in advance on Neighbourhood Matters. This is a **free service** which allows you to receive updates regarding crime in your area and also allows you to message your local officer. If you know people who do not have access to the internet, please feel free to share the information. The more people who know about these drop-ins, the better! Some of the regular sessions we do are coffee mornings in the villages, outside village shops, in village halls (including the car parks), and coffee shops, meetings with the local farmers and rural community and school visits.

Reporting Incidents

Please remember to report crime and any incidents via 999, 101 or on the West Mercia website. Please do not email individual officers if a crime has happened, this needs to be reported officially through the correct channels.

Parish Council

Every three months, Parish Councils make us aware of their Parish priorities. If you are aware of any specific areas of continued concern in your area, please make your Parish Council aware in order for them to pass this over to your local officer.

ST JAMES CHURCH BADSEY - NEW ELECTORAL ROLL

The Church of England requires every parish to have a list of those entitled to vote in church elections. Once every six years the Roll is completely renewed and this year, 2025, we are once again starting afresh with a new Electoral Roll.

If you have been on the Roll before you need to complete a new form to be included on the new Roll. If you are a new member of our congregation or would like to become a member you might also consider applying to have your name added.

To qualify to be included, you must:

- Be baptised
- Be 16 years old or over
- Live in the Ecclesiastical Parish of Badsey with Aldington or have been a regular worshipper at St James Church for more than six months, if you reside elsewhere.

You can be on the Roll if you are a member of any church in communion with the Church of England or of any other church that subscribes to the doctrine of the Holy Trinity if you are prepared to declare yourself a member of the Church of England.



You can obtain forms for the Application for Enrolment from St James Church or at the following web address: https://www.parishresources.org.uk/wp-content/uploads/Application-for-Enrolment-Electoral-Roll.pdf. All forms must be completed and signed and returned to St James Church (Box on top of the Font) by Easter Sunday (20th April 2025). Applications to join the new Roll will be accepted from 19th March 2025. A copy of the new Electoral Roll will be published Friday 2nd May 2025.

Joining the Electoral Roll opens the way for greater involvement in the life of your Church, at the local Parochial Church Council, deanery, diocesan and national levels as well as being entitled to vote at the Annual Parochial Church Meeting. With your name on the Roll, the strength of the local church can be seen.

This year's Annual Parochial Church Meeting and Meeting of Parishioners will be on Sunday 18th May at approximately 12pm after morning service.

Whilst it is important to support your local church by helping in its governance it is also essential that as many people as possible in the parish consider a financial commitment towards the upkeep and running of St James. There was a good turnout for the 23rd AGM of The Badsey Society on 7th February, with over 40 people being present. Maureen Spinks was re-elected Chairman and Shirley Tutton was re-elected Secretary. There is still a vacancy for Treasurer following the sad death of Will Dallimore at the end of last year.

After the business part of the meeting, the announcement of the annual Tony Jerram Award was made. The award is given each year in memory of the late Tony Jerram (1937-2008), the first Chair-

man of The Badsey Society, and is given to somebody who the members feel has contributed to the good of the local community. This year, the award was given posthumously to Will Dallimore for his great contribution to village life over the years. This was awarded jointly with his brother, John.

Will's film, "A Journey Through Asum Grammar", first aired at the 2013 AGM, was then shown, to much hilarity. Written and performed by Will, it stars Doug Deep who roams the Vale of Evesham on a two-tine fork in his quest to educate the villagers in the art of Asum Grammar.

Jane Neill's Nature Notes...



As the old saying goes - "So many mists in March you see, So many frosts in May will be".

March is the official month of spring with leaf buds bursting into life and the wildflowers rising from their winter slumber. Spot the daisy named from "days eye" and the mint herb, ground-ivy, with its violet flower, that was used to flavour ale before Henry VIII introduced the hop. It added an aromatic and bitter taste. There are few sweeter scented flowers than the white blackthorn blossom that fills the air at this time.

Look up into the woodland trees before they fully leaf to spot the voluminous squirrel's drey. The grey squirrels have been very busy hiding nuts in my lawn this winter.

Have you ever spotted a "witches broom" that could be mistaken for a bird's nest? It is a galling caused by mites, bacteria, viruses, and fungi on a bud. It creates a mass of shoots living as long as its host tree. Though unsightly, it can form an excellent habitat for several invertebrates.

Birds have begun their courting. The woods echo to the drumming of the spotted woodpecker and my favourite herald of spring – the chiffchaff!

THE ECLIPSES OF MARCH

March is an interesting month for anyone with even a slight interest in the observation of celestial objects, as two similar events occur this month. On the 14th of March, there will be a lunar eclipse and two weeks later, on the 29th of March, there will be a partial solar eclipse. These events are always fascinating and cannot help but generate a sense of wonder.

Unfortunately, here in the Midlands, we are not in the best place to observe either of these two spectacles. A lunar eclipse occurs when the Earth comes between the Sun and the Moon, and the Earth's shadow falls on the Moon. There are three types of lunar eclipses: total, partial, and penumbral. A total lunar eclipse happens when the entire Moon passes through the Earth's shadow, resulting in a dramatic change in the Moon's appearance. During a total lunar eclipse, the Moon will appear a reddish colour, often referred to as a 'Blood Moon'. This is because the only light reaching the Moon is sunlight that has been scattered through the Earth's atmosphere. Such events will only occur when the Moon is full.

On the 14th of March, the lunar eclipse will begin at about 04.00 in the morning reaching a maximum at 06.19, at about the same time as the Sun rises and the Moon sets. So this one is for the keen early risers and disappears before it reaches the best view. Although we are not in the best place to see this lunar eclipse, there will be another on 7th September. Unfortunately, we are not best placed to witness this one either, but the lunar eclipse on 26th August 2026 will be perfectly timed to be seen from this country and, with luck, the weather should be fine at that time of year.

The solar eclipse at the end of the month occurs when the moon passes between us and the Sun. This obviously can only occur on a new Moon, hence 14 days after the lunar eclipse. It will start at 10.05 in the morning, reaching its maximum at 11.03, and be completed by 12.01, lasting just under two hours. This will only be a partial eclipse but about a third of the Sun will be covered. It goes without saying that you should never look directly at the Sun with the naked eye. However, safe solar eclipse glasses are readily available from major online retailers for as little as 50p each if you don't mind ordering ten or more.

Solar eclipses seem to occur almost at random but there are recognised sequences that are used to predict the next eclipse. The eclipse on the 29th of March is one of a sequence that occurs every 177 days and four hours. It will cast the same path of the shadow across the surface of the Earth each time, but the Earth will have turned by an extra four hours, so the shadow will fall across a different part of the Earth.

Seven different cycles of solar eclipses have been identified; some of these cycles last 18 or 19 years and some a matter of months. This gives the apparently random nature of their appearance, yet they can be quite easily predicted with a little mathematics. The next total eclipse here in the UK will be on 23rd September 2090 and will probably be best viewed in Cornwall again.

The two eclipses in March present a wonderful opportunity for skywatchers and enthusiasts in the UK to witness these celestial phenomena. Whether you are observing the partial solar eclipse or the total lunar eclipse, remember to take the necessary precautions for safe viewing. Prepare your viewing equipment, find a suitable location, and get ready to experience the magic of the March eclipses.
