The Church Clock Chimes Again!

Thank you, from Badsey with Aldington Parochial Church Council, to all those generous people who donated £1155 towards the £2600 cost of refurbishing the entire chime mechanism.

It is thought that with only minor repairs, the chime mechanism had run for well over one hundred years. The system, which is a complex system of wires, pulleys, and levers, has been completely refurbished and took two clock engineers from Time Assured over eight hours on site to install. Much of the work entailed is in cramped conditions under the bell frame, and involved feeding the new stainless steel wires up from the clock chamber to the hammers in the bell chamber.

Thank you to all who donated over the last few years to the full service of the clock mechanism and the repainting of the face - this finishes a complete restoration of the timepiece. Without your donations and those who leave legacies, this project and similar maintenance projects would be difficult to fund.

ASK THE HISTORY MAN...

Churchwardens' Accounts - Old Style

As far as we are aware, it is exactly 500 years since the Badsey churchwardens began to keep basic financial records. In 1898, the Reverend W. H. Price (vicar of Badsey from 1897 to 1903) undertook the work of transcribing the original manuscript. In 1913, ten years after Mr Price's sudden death following a fatal heart attack during a church service, a portion of the work, covering the period from 1525 to 1571, was published, including many explanatory notes.

Whilst a large number of the entries remain somewhat obscure (certainly to the present writer), we can nevertheless get a good general idea of the kind of transactions which took place in those days. On the expenditure side, frequent payments were necessary for the maintenance of the church bells. We find entries for 'ye medyng of ye belle whele', 'ye clapur of ye foure belle', 'belle ropys', 'ye bawdryke' and so on. The last item, which occurs regularly over the years under several different spellings, is a baldrick - a leather strap which fastens the clapper to the ring at the crown of a bell.

All this confirms that there were bells at the church 500 years ago, probably hung when the tower was built in the mid-fifteenth century.

Evidently, work on the roof was required in 1551-52, as there are a number of payments for materials such as 'naysl', 'sklatte', and 'a bondel of lathe', as well as 'a creste for ye porche'.

So, where did the churchwardens get their money from? One surprising source is the large number of legacies received, at a time when most people were surely very poor, and not all of these come from within the parish. John Wodhouse, vicar of Bretforton, left 'to the church of Badsey four shillings to be payd yn barley so far as hyt wyll extend and after in money.'

Some years later came eight pence from 'ye bequest of ye goodwyfe Wodhouse', who was possibly the late vicar's widow. As for fundraising, a popular method appears to have been a sort of gift day, when young ladies stood near the church door to collect the people's contributions, as in 1528-29, when four shillings and eight pence was 'reseuyd of ye madnys gedyng' (the maidens' gathering).

Another, perhaps more entertaining, method of boosting the finances was whencockeral was put in an earthenware pot, which was then suspended from a tree branch. Competitors paid a halfpenny a throw, and the one who broke the pot with his stone claimed the bird.

Although these simple records are in some ways incomplete, nevertheless, they do give us an interesting insight into the financial affairs of our forebears at Badsey Church. At least they did not have the present-day problem of finding money to satisfy our ever-demanding Diocese of Worcester!

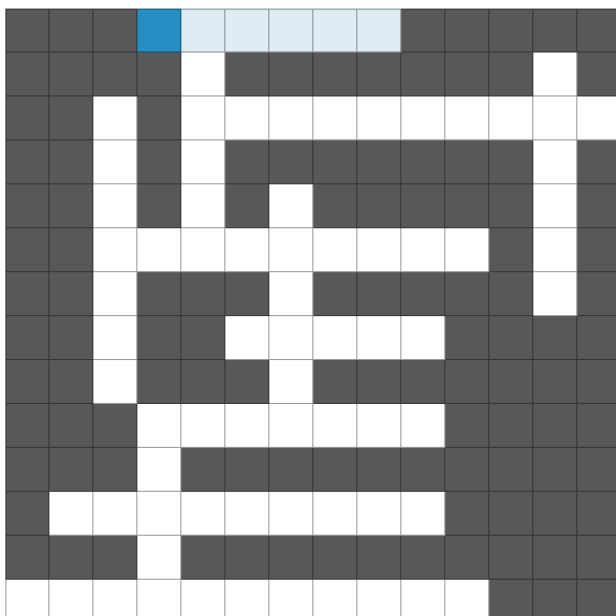

BADSEY SOAPBOX RACES ROLL TO A FINAL STOP

After many years of quirky fun and fast-paced community spirit, the Badsey Soapbox Races have officially come to an end.

The races first took off in 2016, sparked by a chance conversation in the local pub - a fitting origin for a truly homegrown event. The idea quickly gained momentum, with support from Badsey and Aldington Parish Council, and a committee of Parish Councillors and local residents bringing the event to life.

Held every year on the Sunday of the August Bank Holiday weekend, the races were free to watch and soon became a fixture in the village calendar. Over time, the event expanded to include a bar, local stalls, and an inevitable after party at The Wheatsheaf Inn.

In recent years, however, the races have struggled to attract enough entries to remain both entertaining for spectators and financially viable. With declining participation making it increasingly difficult to run the event to its usual standard, organisers have made the decision to call time on the races.

The official statement from the organising committee reads as follows:

"After a review by the organising committee, we have decided to discontinue the soapbox races.

Over the past two years, we have been unable to attract enough entries to make the event financially viable and entertaining for the audience.

We would like to extend our gratitude to everyone who has built carts and participated over the years, as well as to our sponsors who made the event financially possible.

We also want to thank all the volunteers who helped on race day, the committee members who dedicated their time and effort, and the residents of Knowle Hill for allowing us to use their road.

Special thanks go to the team at the Wheatsheaf Inn for providing race headquarters, food, and drinks, as well as to the stallholders who offered barbecues, ice cream, and refreshments throughout the years. Lastly, we appreciate St. John Ambulance for their first aid coverage.

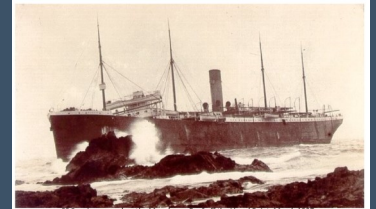

THE MILKY WAY

Hopefully, July will be filled with long hot days and nights and create happy memories of long holidays. However, for stargazers, these days also bring short nights with little time for observing the heavens.

On a good, clear evening, after the sun has set, there is a long period of twilight. During this time, the brightest stars begin to become visible as the sky slowly darkens. It is quite good fun to just sit on a warm evening and try to spot the first star to appear, and usually, you will then spot others shortly after. Of the bright stars that will appear during the early evening, there are three that are of particular interest that form a feature known as the summer triangle. These three stars are known as Vega, Altair and Deneb, and they form a distinctive triangular shape that will be overhead at about midnight during July.

Keep an eye out for the summer triangle as it will help you find this month's Stargazer feature, the Milky Way. At this time of year, this passes from the constellation of Sagittarius on the southern horizon and stretches overhead through the summer triangle. The Milky Way appears as a faint, milky band stretching across the sky, and viewing it can be a breathtaking experience! To get the best view of the Milky Way, you should find a location with minimal light pollution. The centre of the village is not bad, but moving out just a short distance to, say, the sports fields, can make a big difference.

The Milky Way is our galaxy, and we orbit a relatively insignificant small yellow star in one of the "unfashionable" outer arms of a spiral-shaped congregation of between 100 and 400 billion other stars. Personally, I find such numbers quite unimaginable, as are the general dimensions of the Milky Way. The centre of our galaxy lies in the direction of Sagittarius, where there is a bar-shaped bulge in the stellar formation. Unfortunately, much of this shape is not visible due to large black clouds of dust that obscure our view.

The Milky Way is a relatively flat disc 100,000 light years across and about 100 light years in thickness. It takes 225 million years for the sun to orbit the galactic centre, so it was one 'galactic year' ago when dinosaurs were just beginning to walk the Earth. The Sun is 27,000 light years from the galactic centre and sits in what is known as the Orion Arm of the Milky Way. Most of the individual stars that we can see with the naked eye are in the Orion Arm and within about 500 light years of the Sun.

At the beginning of the 20th century, most astronomers thought that the Milky Way was the entire universe. It was through the work of Edwin Hubble and other astronomers during the 1920s that objects outside the Milky Way were first identified, as other galaxies and their distances were measured. The Universe suddenly got much, much bigger, and the incredible size of the Milky Way became much less significant.

The Milky Way is a fascinating and awe-inspiring feature of our night sky. The best time to see it will be before the moon rises or after it has set. There will be a new moon on 24th July and only a small crescent for a few days on either side of that date. So why not find a dark spot in your garden, or take a late-night stroll out of the village centre, and look for this truly awe-inspiring sight?

Jane Neill's Nature Notes...

July 15th, St. Swithin's Day, traditionally decides whether the summer weather will be wet or dry. As the saying goes, if it rained on that day, "for forty days it will remain".

I have been enchanted by the male blackbirds singing as they have been busy breeding in and around the garden. The Anglo-Saxons called them "ouzels", but it changed to blackbird in Medieval times. They can have as many as four broods a year. The males are black with a yellow beak and eye ring, and the females are brown. They live for around four years but can survive up to 20 years.



They eat worms, insects, fruit and berries, and are the first birds to sing at dawn. When they are wary, they make a "spink" sound and a rattled sound of alarm as they fly from danger. By the end of the month, they fall silent as they hide to moult.



Blackbirds have always been a favourite here and in Europe. It is the national bird of Sweden, and homesick emigrants to Australia and New Zealand took some with them, where they are thriving. **Come September, their gentle song will ring out again in the hedgerows and fields.** I'll be listening!



COMPUTER CLUB
