### **NEW ON-DEMAND BUS NETWORK LAUNCHES THIRD SERVICE IN WYCHAVON**

After two successful rollouts in Bromsgrove and Malvern, Worcestershire’s flexible on-demand bus network has launched its third service in Wychavon.

The on-demand transfer service has no fixed routes or timetables, providing a convenient alternative to regular public transport and offering people more control over their travel.

The service operates from 7 am to 7 pm Monday to Saturday, for just £2.50 per person per journey, and additional passengers pay £1.25. The service also accepts concessionary cards and offers free travel to veterans. Discounts are also offered to frequent users of the service.

Journeys can be booked via the Worcestershire on Demand app, which allows users to select their pick-up and drop-off points, as well as view updates on bus arrivals in real time



**Loved and valued – a letter from Trevor Burton.**

I often walk around Badsey pushing my granddaughter in her buggy. Sometimes she walks and is quite determined to go “that way”. We often meet other people and my granddaughter loves to say “Morning”. One day while we were out her shoelace came undone and she tripped over it. Whilst consoling her, a lovely young mum came along and did the shoelaces up.

There is a Fare Share shed in Badsey where food is dropped off. Occasionally, I have the privilege of collecting the food. I am grateful for those who help me unload my car. People come to the shed and conversations start. One Friday, I had not put the food out, and I saw someone with several empty bags walking away, rather sad. My thoughts weren’t very nice towards him but God spoke to me and challenged me to run after him and let him know that I was about to put the food out. At the shed, he opened up and told me why he needed the food. This made me see him in a different light.

Once a month I work the night time economy in Evesham as a Street Pastor. Some people go out for enjoyment others have no choice but to be out. Occasionally, because of the nature of the environment, incidents happen and we engage and help people. Subsequently we are thanked and people share their situations. As Street Pastors we go out there because we value those we see on the streets. As a result they often allow us to pray with them.

Badsey church uses their building to run a Stay and Play “Drop in” every Monday during term time with toys, music (and a free cuppa). It is wonderful to see grandparents, mums and dads coming along with their children. It gives them the opportunity to get out of the house. My granddaughter has changed so much, interacting with the other children. The children and grandparents (and parents) are valued, and the adults receive support when they share their struggles. I often walk around the village praying. I meet and have conversations with people.

Whilst praying I was challenged by God to write this article. You may not believe in God. There was a time I didn’t, however, I have faced tough situations in my life but I can testify how God has stepped into my life and revealed to me His love for me in tangible ways. This has happened especially after allowing someone to pray with me.

Wednesday morning at Badsey Church is a work group that meets. It doesn’t matter if you’re not into gardening, it is a time for meeting others to chat and share. There are a lot of issues going on in the world, and political challenges for us in this country. We all face upheavals in our lives and we grieve and struggle dealing with these issues. You are welcome to come along on a Wednesday to talk to others about these or anything else over a coffee. We are a bunch of ordinary imperfect people who value each other and love to spend time with each other. It is a hub for connection, reflection and shared experiences. If you need it, some of us are happy to offer support and pray with you.



## THE BADSEY SOCIETY DIVES INTO DARK DEEDS AND DEADLY PLOTS

To Murder a Priest: The Popish Plot and Worcestershire (1678 - 1681)

October's talk will be given by Doug Smith. It promises to be an entertaining evening! Doug describes his talk as follows:

“Lies, intrigue and death threats at the very centre of Power! This may sound familiar, but it's Worcestershire in the late 17th Century. This talk is not for viewers of a nervous disposition! This is a story of the turmoil following the Reformation of the 16th Century and the Civil Wars of the 17th Century. It involves a pantomime villain of epic proportions, an unbelievable tale that many believed and the death of innocent people. The events took place at the end of the reign of the Merry Monarch, Charles II (1660-1685). I will use examples from Worcestershire to show how this tale, centred on London, affected the whole kingdom.”

Douglas H Smith (Doug) is a retired secondary school History teacher with over 40 years of experience. In 2012, he was awarded an MBE for Services to Education. Since retirement, he has spent more time on his love of history and his written four books and numerous booklets. The books are: Cheer Boys it's Hartlebury!, Whose For the Game? From Trams to Trenches, and finally Most Poorly and Cowardly: Hartlebury Castle and North Worcestershire in the Civil Wars 1642-1660. He became a Trustee at Hartlebury Castle in 2021.

## **JOIN THE SS SUEVIC AND THE NIGHT THE RNLI SAVED 611 PEOPLE!**

**With The Badsey Society**

**Friday 19 September at 7.30 at the Recreation Club**

Speaker: Galen Bartholomew

The SS Suevic ran aground in a storm off the Lizard Point in Cornwall in March 1907. The RNLI rescued 456 people in appalling weather conditions. This is still the largest number of people rescued by the RNLI in a single operation. Another ship, the SS Jebba, ran aground off the South Devon coast the same night and the RNLI saved a further 155 lives. Not a single life was lost in either rescue. In those days, lifeboats were open rowing boats and the crews were untrained local volunteers! This illustrated talk describes how Galen Bartholomew pieced together an extraordinary story: how the Suevic ran aground; how she was salvaged and rebuilt; her service in two wars; and her final years as a whaling factory ship in the Antarctic, before being scuttled off the coast of Sweden to avoid capture by German warships. As well as the number of people rescued, both the salvage and rebuilding of the Suevic set records in 1907. A focus throughout is on the brave crews of the RNLI, which celebrated its bi-centenary in March 2024. Galen Bartholomew has been a keen family historian for 50 years. When he discovered that his great-grandmother and great-aunt were amongst those rescued from the Suevic, he was keen to find out more about this. Little did he imagine that his relatives had been involved in one of the most famous of RNLI rescues! The traumatic events explain why Galen's family had virtually 'forgotten' that terrible night – 1907 was well before people were encouraged to talk about difficult experiences! This is a remarkable account of shipwreck and survival.

## Jane Neill's Nature Notes...

September nights are drawing in, but we can still scan the skies at dusk for bats or “flittermouse”, the old country name given as they were believed to be flying mice.

In Britain, bats are fully protected. We have 14 bat species, but the most commonly seen is the common pipistrelle, the smallest bat, weighing just 5 grams, the weight of a 2p coin. The pipistrelle’s wing is made from an extended finger of a hand with stretched skin spanning 20cm.

In summer, they hang on the outside of buildings and only in winter seek shelter inside. They fly at dusk to feed and can consume up to 3,000 insects in a night. They emit an ultrasonic squeak as they fly, and the speed at which the sound returns determines if an object is close or far. It can distinguish a telephone wire, a leaf or a beetle. Prey too big to eat on the wing is carried to a nearby perch on which it clings with a sharply hooked claw. Its teeth, in comparison to size, are more awesome than a tiger's! A remarkable mammal. No wonder I search the sky each night when I close the curtains in the hope of spotting one.

## ASK THE HISTORY MAN

### Badsey Pike

Nowadays, it is not often that one hears anyone refer to Badsey Pike. In fact, it may well be that many in the village do not know what or where it is, or the origin of its name. The Pike is the place where Synehurst meets Bretforton Road, and the name derives from an early 18th-century road system.

The first serious attempt to improve the quality of roads throughout the country came in 1555, when Parliament decreed that every parish had a duty to repair its own roads. Road surveyors were appointed each year at a parish meeting, with the responsibility of organising the necessary labour to carry out the work. Farmers and other employers were obliged to release all able-bodied men for this purpose, usually for four days each year. This was known as Statute Labour.

From 1706 onwards, numerous Acts of Parliament authorised the creation of 'turnpike trusts' as a result of which various lengths of roads were taken away from parish control and put under the management of turnpike trustees, who became responsible for the maintenance of their particular stretch of road. In order to finance their activities, they erected gates and levied tolls on vehicles and livestock passing through.

The first Act authorising turnpiking in the Evesham District was in 1728, naming several roads leading from the town, including one to Bretforton. Thus did Badsey enter the turnpike system. The amount of the toll was prescribed in the Act and varied according to what was travelling through the gate. Two examples are given below:

'For every coach, berlin (burlin), chariot, chaise or calash drawn by two horses - 6 d.'

'For every drove of calves, hogs, sheep or lambs per score - 10 d.'

We do not know when a toll gate was first erected at Badsey. A newspaper advertisement of 1826 refers to the Badsey and Bretforton gates together yielding an income of £245 a year, and when the Badsey Manor Estate was sold in 1866, one lot was 'all that valuable piece of pasture land and orchard, lying near the toll gate on the Evesham road'.

The plan attached to the sale notice clearly shows the toll gate a short distance on the Evesham side of the junction. By that time, however, the turnpike system was in rapid decline. The duties of the trustees were taken over by local highway boards, which had the power to levy a highway rate. In 1888, the newly established county councils took on responsibility for all main roads.



## SPOTTING VEGA

September brings early evenings and hopefully warm, mild weather that is ideal for stargazing. When first taking up the hobby of astronomy, people will often say, "What's that Star?" pointing at the brightest or first star to appear. During the summer months and early autumn, this is usually a bright blue-white star called Vega that is high in the southern skies.



Vega is the dazzling jewel of the constellation Lyra and has captivated the attention and imagination of humanity across centuries. Vega, designated Alpha Lyrae, is the brightest star in the constellation Lyra and the fifth-brightest star in the night sky. To the unaided eye, Vega gleams with a strikingly blue-white hue. It is located only 25 light-years from Earth and is therefore one of our Sun's nearest stellar neighbours and shines with a brilliance that has made it a subject of fascination for astronomers, poets, and stargazers alike.

Vega's position in the northern sky makes it a circumpolar star for much of the northern hemisphere and can be seen for all of the year. During the summer and autumn months, however, Vega soars overhead as part of the famous Summer Triangle, a prominent asterism formed by Vega, Deneb (in Cygnus), and Altair (in Aquila). Its apparent magnitude makes it one of the most visible stars, easily outshining most others in the sky.

Vega is a main-sequence star fusing hydrogen into helium in its core, much like our Sun, but hotter and more massive. Its surface temperature is about 9,600 Kelvin, giving it that distinctive blue-white colour. Vega is estimated to be 2.1 times as massive as the Sun and about 40 times as luminous. One of Vega's most remarkable features is its rotation. Vega spins extremely rapidly on its axis, completing a rotation in roughly 12.5 hours, compared to the Sun's 27-day rotation. This rapid spin causes Vega to take on an oblate shape, being noticeably flattened at the poles and bulged at the equator. This distortion also means that its equator is cooler than its poles.

For much of modern astronomical history, Vega has been the cornerstone of photometric calibration. Astronomers have long used Vega as the 'zero point' in the magnitude scale, calibrating the brightness measurements of other celestial objects by comparison with Vega's light. While other standards are now used for greater precision, Vega's role in shaping the magnitude system remains fundamental.

Vega also has the distinction of being the first star (other than the Sun) to have its spectrum photographed, an achievement realised in 1872 by Henry Draper. This milestone marked the beginning of the discipline of stellar spectroscopy, allowing scientists to unravel the chemical compositions and physical properties of stars. Vega's relatively simple spectrum, dominated by hydrogen lines, has made it a model object for stellar classification.

Vega is about 455 million years old, quite young compared to our 4.6-billion-year-old Sun. However, as a more massive and hotter star, Vega will live a much shorter life than the Sun. Astronomers estimate that Vega is nearing the midpoint of its main-sequence phase. Eventually, it will exhaust its hydrogen fuel, expand into a red giant, and then shed its outer layers, leaving behind a white dwarf. For amateur astronomers, Vega is one of the easiest celestial objects to locate.

Throughout the summer and autumn, look high in the southern sky after sunset for a star that shines brighter than nearly all others. Binoculars and telescopes can reveal its blue-white colour in more detail. Vega is far more than a bright point of light in the northern sky. It is a gateway to understanding stellar physics. The more we study Vega, the richer our appreciation for both the universe and our place within it becomes.

As you gaze up at the sky on a clear autumn evening, take a few moments to spot Vega, one of our nearest neighbours, and enjoy the spectacle shimmering above.
