### SAVE THE DATE FOR COMMUNITY, CELEBRATION AND SUMMER AT BADSEY CHURCH

March is the month when we can start to feel that Spring is really here. After the weeks of endless rain in January and February, the daffodils are out, and the birds are singing away in the trees and hedges each morning. This month, the church calendar reminds us that we are still in the season of Lent - but we celebrate Mothering Sunday (15th March for those of you needing a reminder to send a card!) on our way towards Easter (5th April).

We think of it as a day to remember the people who have mothered us, showing love and care – and it is a really good day to say thank you to them, in any way that we can. But Mothering Sunday isn't only about our own mothers – it is also a reminder for many of us that the work of mothering is done on a much larger scale within a community. When doors are opened, and a warm welcome and a safe space are offered to anyone who steps inside, then conversations can begin, and connections can be made. Friendships can grow stronger, and we can feel like we really belong here.

Badsey's church is a beautiful, much-loved building, and you can see the tower from nearly every direction – a real landmark. But as I tell everyone who comes to one of our special services, the church is more than just the walls and roof, more than the bells and the clock chiming the hours. The core of the church is its people: congregation, wardens, me and anyone else who wants to be there.

We have so much going on outside our Sunday morning services! Every day, one of our wardens unlocks the door and locks it again each evening. This means that anyone can pop into the church during the day, certain of finding a safe, calm, peaceful space where you can breathe, think, meditate, or pray. On Monday mornings in term time, our lovely volunteers welcome carers with babies and toddlers for a play session and a cuppa, ending with some singing. Wednesday mornings see the St James Gardening Group gathering for some weeding in the churchyard and some morning tea afterwards. We also hold a coffee morning on the first Thursday of each month, which has been very popular ever since it started last year.

Still, others are on hand for our services as welcomers, readers, tea-makers, cleaners, etc. Some do it because it feels like a natural way to put their faith into action – it's what loving your neighbour can look like when you get out of bed on Monday morning. Some lend a hand because this is a way of building our community and keeping our village such a great place to live, or simply as a way to show kindness.

*Whatever the reasons, we love what we do, and we are planning a very special summer celebration on Saturday, July 4th*

More details to follow later in the year - but any offers of help with this or more generally in future as a "Friend of Badsey Church" would be much appreciated – could you be an occasional cake maker, raffle/tombola prize collector, have bright ideas for stalls or future events? We would love to hear from you.



## THE PLEIADES

As I sit writing this article at the beginning of February, I don't think I have seen the night sky for over a month. The long, dry days of summer are a thing of the past; everywhere seems to be drenched, and the garden feels very soft and muddy. As the days are finally getting longer and the clocks go forward at the end of the month, this will make us all feel better to know that spring is well on its way. However, it is not so good for Astronomy as the nights get shorter. This is really the last month this year to get a good view of the magnificent winter constellations that have been with us since they first appeared in the evenings in November. Once we get into April, Orion and Taurus set in the western sky earlier and earlier each evening.

This month's object is one of my favourites: the Pleiades. If you locate the three stars that form the belt of Orion and follow a line up and to the right through the head of Taurus, you find a light grey smudge containing a large number of bright, closely packed stars.

The Pleiades star cluster, also known as The Seven Sisters and Messier 45 (M45), is one of the most prominent and easily recognisable open star clusters in the night sky. It is notable for its bright, blue stars and a distinctive pattern that has captivated observers for centuries.

The cluster is situated at an approximate distance of 444 light-years from Earth, making it one of the closest open clusters to our solar system. At this distance, it is really in our local neighbourhood in the Milky Way. The cluster spans a diameter of roughly 17.5 light-years, with a core radius of about 4 light-years.

The brightest stars in the cluster are known as the Seven Sisters, although there are probably 14 stars that can be seen with the naked eye. These are all blue giant stars, each being over a thousand times more luminous than the sun. There are also another 1,000 or so other stars, some being similar to our sun, but many are very faint red and brown dwarfs. Red dwarfs are the most common stars in the Milky Way, but are small and long-lived. These low-mass, dim stars burn hydrogen fuel incredibly slowly, allowing them to live for trillions of years. Brown dwarfs are even smaller and are not fully formed stars, as they are not big enough to sustain nuclear fusion. They are more like extra-large Jupiters.

On a clear evening and about an hour after sunset, the Pleiades should be relatively easy to find in the southwesterly skies, and they should be visible for most of the night. As a stellar cluster, they are quite beautiful to see and fascinating to study as an astronomical object. It is worth finding a pair of binoculars to enable you to see even more detail and beauty in this quite magnificent stellar object.

## THE TONY JERRAM AWARD

The Tony Jerram Award is presented each year in memory of the late Tony Jerram (1937 -2008), the first Chairman of The Badsey Society, and is given to someone who the members feel has contributed to the good of the local community.

This year, the award has been given to Marlene Atkinson for her 30 years of service to St James' Church. Marlene retired through ill-health last year from being the church organist and choir mistress, posts that she had held for many years. She was a very able pianist rather than an organist, but became proficient with experience.

Marlene played for services, sometimes twice on a Sunday, mostly for no fee. Those services where she received a fee, she usually donated back to St James' Church or to charity. A very reliable and extremely competent person, she organised choir practices and led the choir with skill, but would accept no nonsense! She has already been greatly missed by both congregation and choir members alike – a much-loved person but slightly feared by all!

Marlene is now a resident at Briarlea Care Home and was too frail to attend the AGM, so three members of The Badsey Society committee paid her a visit. Marlene's son, Tim, had told her to expect special visitors, so she was left wondering who to expect – possibly relatives from Australia? But no, it was Jane Neill and Alan and Shirley Tutton who were there to present the award.

Marlene was surprised and delighted to receive the trophy, and then spent a long time reminiscing about Tony Jerram. She is indeed a worthy recipient of this year's award in recognition of her many years of voluntary service.



## TRANSFORMATION, DETERMINATION, INSPIRATION: POPPY'S STORY

A Badsey mum is celebrating a remarkable transformation after losing more than five stone and says joining a 7am Saturday Slimming World group helped her rediscover herself, both as a parent and as a person.

Twenty-eight-year-old Poppy Woodward joined the group after realising she had stopped prioritising her own health following the birth of her son. Like many new parents, she admits her focus was entirely on caring for her child, often at the expense of her own wellbeing.

*"At the time my little boy was not even a year old," she said. "I was making sure he was eating the right things, but I was not doing the same for myself. Once he was asleep, I would often order a takeaway. I suddenly thought, why are we not sitting down together as a family and eating the same meal?"*

That realisation became a turning point. Poppy decided she wanted to make a change for herself and for her family. Another major motivation was her love of netball. Having played since school, the sport has always been important to her. However, as her weight increased, her fitness declined and knee pain worsened.

*"I used to play in a high level league, but I had to step down because my body could not keep up," she explained. "Mentally I knew how to play, but physically I could not do what I used to. I knew that if I lost the weight, I could enjoy netball again comfortably and confidently."*

Although she felt nervous about starting again, Poppy says she was quickly reassured by the warm welcome at the group. *"I never expected a Saturday morning group to be so busy," she said. "There are lots of groups locally, but this one has grown so much and I understand why."*

Since joining, Poppy has lost five and a half stone. She says the biggest change has been in her confidence and credits the supportive atmosphere and encouragement from fellow members. *"There was friendly competition with another member at the same stage as me, which really pushed us both," she said. "Seeing others succeed made me think, that can be me too."*

Now Poppy hopes her story will inspire others, particularly parents of young children, to take the first step. *"It is not a diet, it is a lifestyle change," she said. "Some weeks are better than others, but you always start fresh. If I can do this, anyone can."*

Jess Walsh, consultant for the Badsey group, said Poppy's achievement has inspired other members and shows how the group's healthy eating approach can fit around family life while supporting lasting changes in mindset and behaviour.

## [ASK THE HISTORY MAN](#)    **Badsey Shops: Part Three**

Of the shops mentioned in our previous articles, those of Brewer and Salter, with their modest grocery stores, as well as Wheatley the butcher and Crisp at the Post Office, continued throughout the 1920s and 1930s and also during the Second World War. Others gradually joined them.

First was Mrs Emma Dungworth with a tiny shop in the front room of her house at 13 Chapel Street, next door to the earlier one run by Sarah Hutchings, which was by then closed. Then came Ernest and Ada Rebecca Jones at the south end of the building, which now houses the Spar shop.

The Joneses always stocked a barrel of vinegar, and customers went with their bottles or jugs to buy a pint or two for use in homemade pickles. In due course, they became well known for the excellence of their ice cream. The other part of the premises was occupied by Lewis Gravely Stribblehill, a wheelwright and undertaker.

During the 1930s, two shops were established on Bretforton Road. Mrs Doris Smith at number 14 stocked a few basic items, whilst at number 11, Raymond and Dora Butler similarly sold sweets, cigarettes, and not much else. But before long, the Butlers moved to a new premises next door and quickly began to expand their range of goods.

One of the items on offer was lemonade, supplied by George Brearley's mineral water factory in Evesham. The lemonade came in returnable bottles, and on purchasing one, there was a deposit of one penny to pay, which was refundable on returning the empty bottle to the shop. Raymond was in the habit of stacking the empty bottles in their crates outside his back door, ready for return to the supplier, until he discovered that certain mischievous boys had gone round the back under cover of darkness, removed some of the bottles and claimed the pennies on them at the shop the next day. (For the avoidance of doubt, the writer of this article was not among the culprits!)

This period also saw the emergence of another butcher's shop. Elgar and Helen Hartwell lived at Holywell Villa, at number 10 High Street (not the present house, but an earlier one on the same site), and they opened their shop in the nearby outbuildings (now converted into a private residence). They dealt mainly in pork products.

At Aldington, Jim Cole and his wife had a shop, including a Post Office, at the White House on Main Street.

## Jane Neill's Nature Notes...

March is the traditional start of Spring, though the weather can still be wintery at times. When the rising sun brings warmer days, the insects emerge from their shelters. Peacock, brimstone and tortoiseshell butterflies visit the mass of yellow celandine growing along the brook. Ladybirds, bees and beesflies take to their wings. Cowslips were known as the "Keys of St. Peter". They have a unique milky scent likened to cow's breath or that of a new baby. Once upon a time, they were almost picked to extinction as they made a very seductive cowslip wine. Children enjoyed sucking the sweet nectar from the flowers.

As the Winter migrants, like the redwing and fieldfare, leave our shores, I shall be listening intently in the woods for the chiffchaff. My herald of Spring!
