#### **A Strong Constitution**



## The Things we do in the Name of Research!

One day in March, some Badsey Society Committee members were to be seen disporting themselves in all manner of weird postures in the effort to bring some fascinating maps to the attention of a wider public. Richard Phillips had been contacted by Dr Nick Evans of the Geography Department at University College, Worcester, who had discovered the Badsey website, in particular the children's market gardening letters, and realised that there were people in the village who might be interested in seeing some growers' maps in his possession. The maps date back to the 1940s and show in very precise and large detail the land-holding pattern of growing in Badsey at this time, including shape of land parcel, area in fractions of acres and, most importantly, the precise name of the grower.

So thus it was that Richard, together with Terry Sparrow and Maureen Spinks, paid a visit to Worcester. Dr Evans said that we were lucky to be able to see the maps, because he had chanced upon them by accident when they were about to be placed in the skip! The maps were very fragile and necessitated Maureen sprawling on the floor trying to keep them flat (but at the same time keeping her fingers out of the way), whilst Richard, legs astride, danced around at many different angles to take photos with his digital camera. Meanwhile, the Chairman was busy pumping the pay-and-display machine with more money, as we were in danger of collecting a parking fine!
