

MEMORANDUM. That on Sunday the *sixteenth* day of
August in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred
and three, the Reverend William Carmont Allsebrook
M.A., Vicar of Badsey with Aldington

in the County _____ and Diocese of *Worcester* _____ did
in his Parish Church of *Badsey* _____
aforesaid publicly and openly in the presence of the congregation there assembled read
the Articles of Religion commonly called the Thirty-nine Articles agreed upon in
Convocation in the year of our Lord 1562, and did immediately after reading the
same make the following Declaration of Assent, videlicet :

"I William Carmont-Allsebrook, Clerk, M.A.,
do solemnly make the following Declaration:—I assent to the Thirty-nine Articles
of Religion which I have now read before you, and to the book of Common Prayer
and of the ordering of Bishops, Priests, and Deacons. I believe the Doctrine
of the Church of England, as therein set forth, to be agreeable to the Word
of God; and in Public Prayer and administration of the Sacraments I will use
the Form in the said Book prescribed, and none other, except so far as shall be
ordered by lawful authority."

Witness our hands the day and year above written.
