We do by these Presents give and grant to you (in whose Fidelity, Morals, Learning, sound Doctrine, and Diligence, We do fully confide) our Licence and Authority to perform the Office of Curate or Vicar of the Perpetual Curacy or Vicarage and Parish Church of Wickhamford in the County of Worcester within Our Diocese and Jurisdiction vacant by the death of William Henry Price, Clerk the last Incumbent there, to which you are nominated to Us by the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Christ in Oxford of the Foundation of King Henry the Eighth the true and undoubted Patrons thereof in full right (as it is asserted)

in preaching the Word of God, and in reading the Common Prayers and performing all other Ecclesiastical Duties belonging to the said Office, according to the Form prescribed in the Book of Common Prayer and of the Ordering of Bishops, Priests, and Deacons, made and published by Authority of Parliament, and the Canons and Constitutions in that behalf lawfully established and promulged, and none other, except so far as shall be ordered by lawful authority—You having previously before Us

made and subscribed the Declaration of Assent and the Declaration against Simony, and taken the Oath of Allegiance now appointed by Law to be made, taken, and subscribed, and sworn to pay true and Canonical Obedience to Us and our Successors Bishops of Worcester, in all things lawful and honest.—

AND We do by these Presents authorize you to receive and enjoy all and singular the stipend, profits, and advantages whatsoever, belonging to the said Perpetual Curacy or Vicarage.

IN WITNESS whereof, we have caused our Episcopal Seal to be hereunto affixed. Dated the twenty fifth — day of August — in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and three and in the second year of our Consecration.
