

N. B. The Rev^d. Charles Gore D.D. formerly Fellow of Trinity Coll: Oxford and Canon of Westminster was consecrated Bishop of Worcester in Lambeth Palace Chapel on Sunday February 23rd 1902 by The Archbishop of Canterbury (Dr. Temple)
He was enthroned in Worcester Cathedral on Tuesday February 25th 1902.

Tuesday November 4th 1902. A service of Dedication of a stained glass window placed at the East End of Badsey Church ^{over Altar} was held at 3pm. The window was presented to the Church, in memory of the late Rev^d. Thomas Henry Hunt M.A. Student of Christ Church Oxford and from 1852 to 1887 Vicar of Badsey with Aldington & Wickhamford, by his Children.
The service of Dedication was performed by the Rev^d. T. H. Vines M.A. Rector of Fiskerton Lincoln and an old friend of Mr. Hunt.
The subject of the Window is as follows: Central Panel "Our Saviour as The Good Shepherd"
North Panel S. Michael. South Panel S. Gabriel. The window was executed by Messrs James Powell & Sons Whitefriars Glass Works London. E.C.

Monday December 15. 1902. Two new bells made by Mears & Stainbank of London and provided by public subscription were brought to Badsey & hung in the Tower.
The 2 new bells were first rung in peal with the old six on Friday evening Dec. 19. 1902.

Thursday February 12th 1902. The Bishop of Worcester (Dr. Gore) came to Badsey to dedicate the new Clock which had been placed in the Tower in the previous week by the firm of John Smith & Sons Derby. The Clock was made to strike the quarters with Westminster Chimes and the Hours. The estimate for Clock was £128, but there were extra expenses for Case & local Carpenter's work.
The two new Bells were also dedicated by the Bishop on this day.

The Rev^d. C. G. Gepp M.A. Rector of Wood Norton Norfolk & formerly Vicar of Badsey & Wickhamford died at Wood Norton Rectory on January 17th 1903.
