

Clopn Stratford Directory, Master of Arts, Vicar General in Spirituals of The RIGHT REVEREND FATHER IN GOD, Charles, by Divine Permission BISHOP OF WORCESTER, and Principal Official of his Consistory Court there lawfully appointed, To the Churchwardens of the Sourishes of Badsey and Wiekhamford in the County and Divinese of Worcester.

WHEREAS the Perpetual Curacy or Vicarage and Soush Church of Badsey with Aldington and the Serpetual Curacy or Vicarage and Saush Church of Wichhamford aforesaid by the death of William Henry True, Clerk, M. a. last Incumbent there is become void and destitute of a Pastor and WE consulting the indemnity of the Church and succeeding Vicar and being very desirous according to our duty to provide that special care be taken of the Souls of the Parishioners there, and that the Divine Offices may be decently and laudably celebrated and performed during the vacancy have decreed to be Sequestered, and by these Presents DO SEQUESTER All the Tithes, Tithe Rent Charges, Fruits, Rents, Annuities, Issues, Profits, Perquisites, and all Ecclesiastical Rights belonging to the said Benefices from the time of the death - of the said Incumbent, AND WE do hereby nominate and appoint you the said Churchwardens of the Jaushes of Badsey and Wickhamford SEQUESTRATORS in this behalf giving and granting unto you full power and authority to ask for and demand, sue for, recover, and receive all the said Tithes, Tithe Rent Charges, Fruits, Rents, Annuities, Issues, Profits, Perquisites, and Rights, and the same to keep safely (except such as shall be in danger or peril of perishing) for the use, benefit, and behoof of the next Incumbent.

REQUIRING you to publish this our Decree of Sequestration to the Parishioners and others concerned in and at convenient times and places, And that you take care and provide that the Cure of Souls during the vacancy aforesaid be duly and canonically supplied, and the Divine Service and Sacraments be duly performed and celebrated within the said Churches of Badsey and Wickhamford by some fit and able Minister unto whom you shall pay for his service such a reasonable sum of money as shall be appointed.

REQUIRING that you finally make and give in a faithful account of your administration in this affair unto your Ordinary when you shall be thereunto lawfully required.
