Referring to your call yesterday, we have referred to the papers relating to the sale to Mrs. Crisp but we cannot find any definite information as to the ownership of the hedge between the land sold and the Coppics.

The Land was surveyed by Mr. Raymond Webb and he would perhaps be able to say for certain whether he measured the fence in on the sale to Mrs. Crisp or not.

It may assist you to know that the length of the land sold to Mrs. Crisp adjoining the road was 40 yards and by measuring from the fence erected by her on the North side you should be able to find whether the hedge adjoining the Coppice was included in the sale or not. At the top of the land sold the distance was 12 yards.

We are sorry we cannot help you more but this is all the information in our possession.

We think that Sadler, who occupied the Stockey for so long would be able to say whether or not he repaired the fence which is usually good evidence as to ownership.
