Wires crossing land at Badsey.

Your correspondence with the District Manager, Post Office Telegraphs, Gloucester, has been passed on to me.

I am directed to explain that the Postmaster General possesses a statutory right to carry wires which pass along or across a street or road over land and buildings adjoining or near such street or road, without the consent of the owner or occupier of the property. The wires at Badsey fall within this Category, and the Postmaster General does not require your consent for their continuance, neither is he able to pay rent in respect of them.
