IN YOUR REPLY PLEASE QUOTE:-

Dear Sir

Badsey Glebe.

Referring to your letter of the 15th May in which you draw attention to the four ventilators from the School lavatories which open into the pasture field known as 'The Stockey' which is also a portion of Badsey Glebe and suggesting that an Agreement in similar terms to that entered into in respect of the school house windows should be entered into in the case of these ventilators also, I am directed to point out that the louvre frame in question is built within the County Council wall and does not project over on to the Glebe property. This being so there does not appear to be injury of which the Rev. W. C. Allsebrook can complain. He is not entitled to prevent the County Council enjoying as owners of the Council school at Badsey proper access to the air which their wall and premises are entitled to and the erection of the louvre boards for ventilation is not similar to the case of light.

The non payment of the 1/- due under the Acknowledgment given by the County Council on the 13th Decr. 1912 has been noted: the non-payment arises through an

Order for payment of the sum in question not having been obtained. The arrangement to make this annual payment has however now been duly noted in the Education Finance Department and an Order for payment is being obtained and the amount will be paid over. The payment to be made on the 1st January in each year under the Acknowledgment has been noted and will be regularly made in the future so long as the Acknowledgment is in order and admitted by the County Council.
